TWO BAD FIRES IN AN ODD WAY

Welland Road Roller, Breaks Gas Main, is Burned—Ignites Meth. Church.

WELLAND, Aug. 6.—(Special.)—An unusual accident occurred this afternoon at 5.30 when the town's heavy road roller burst a gas main, an eight-inch pipe leading from the Crowland gas fields.

150 NATIVES KILLED. Warships Fire 2000 Rounds and Land Batteries Are Pretty Badly Damaged.

TANGIER, Aug. 6.—Casablanca, on the Moroccan coast, has been bombarded by French cruisers.

Both France and Spain are hurrying other warships, with troops and marines on board, to various points on the Moroccan coast, for the protection of foreigners.
