Cash Wheat of 21c on That Market—Closed at Higher Prices of the Day—Spot Wheat Weak in Liverpool, but Futures Higher Than Yesterday There.

Friday Evening, June 25. Notwithstanding encouraging cables from Liverpool and the Continent, this morning wheat was on the whole lost its nerve. The market was generally flat, with some scattered gains. All American markets showed recessions and all deliveries declined. The Chicago board cash wheat dropped 25c per bushel, July 1st, 14c, September 19c and December 14c. The fact that St. Louis reports new wheat already threaded in the northwest, weakens the position of the July line. The circumstance that a lot of Letter wheat is being rushed to Paris to anticipate the imposition of the French import duty, seems to have had some effect, also. The general outlook for the growing crop is so bright that damage scares have so far had little effect, hence the weakness of the late options.
