# THE FIRST CONFERENCE

A Proposal to Make All the Book Concerns Contribute Exclusively to Superannuation Fund

WAS TABLED BY A RISING VOTE

The Organic Law of the Church Came Up for Consideration—Committee on Episcopacy.

Chicago, May 14.—The General Conference of the Methodist Church today discussed the question of continuing the profits of the book concerns to the support of the superannuation fund. The question involved the withdrawing of subsidies from churches and publications that could not exist otherwise, and the payment of conference expenses. The discussion was lengthy and at times spirited, but the matter was finally laid on the table by a rising vote.

**Revision of Constitution.**  
Discussion of the report of the Committee on the Revision of the Constitution and the report of the Committee on the Rules for the General Conference followed.

**Delegates to the Ecumenical.**  
A motion by Bishop Foster that a committee be created by the General Conference, consisting of one member from each General Conference district, to select ten delegates to the Ecumenical Methodist Conference in London, was adopted.

**Election of Bishops.**  
The report of the Committee on Elections, which was made public Saturday, recommending that the election of bishops be held under the same conditions as the election of pastors, and resulted in a spirited debate.

**The Choice of Editors.**  
The section providing for the election of editors of the several *Advocates* was recommended to the Book Concerns for further action, the intention being, it is understood, to continue to publish the *Advocates* for which editors are to be selected.

**Chairman Buckley's Report.**  
The time of the session was extended to May 15, and the report of the Chairman of the Book Concerns was read. It was a report of the effectiveness of the Book Concerns, and was adopted.

**Erskine Church Pastorate.**  
A meeting of the congregation of Erskine Presbyterian Church was held this evening to choose a successor to Rev. J. B. Shearer. The claims of seven candidates were considered, and the choice of the congregation fell on Rev. R. Martin of Markham.
