## IDEALS FOR YOUNG MEN.

Hon. George E. Foster furnished some excellent counsel. Association Hall was filled to the doors on Saturday evening with enthusiastic men who had come to hear Hon. George E. Foster speak on the subject, "Canada, a Young Man's Country."

Previous to the address, a very interesting and practical demonstration of gymnastics and feats of skill and strength was given by a number of young men, who were loudly applauded. When the apparatus had been removed, the chairman, Mr. H. H. Fulger, came forward, and introduced the speaker, Hon. George E. Foster.

Mr. Foster was in a particularly happy mood, and more than sustained his reputation as a popular public speaker. His reference to the intimate knowledge those of the up-to-date young men in use in the Public and High schools, placed his audience in good humor to receive the true, earnest counsel which followed.

Canada, he said, must not be regarded by young men as a land in which they can best win fame and fortune, as a country to which they must give their best, mentally, morally and physically.

A Great Heritage. To young men, he said, belongs the prospective ownership of the country; to use a common expression, they will be running it in 25 years, and when we think of what it is now, and what it will be in the future, and what position it will hold among the other nations, it is necessary that the one million young men of the Dominion be impressed with what their country demands of them. The great war of today is the war of trade and commerce, and this will become keener in future, as the rivalry grows between Asia and the nations of Europe, the Republic to the south, and the just-awakening Asiatic nations. Canada must be master of this.

The fact of the country being young, and having such infinite possibilities for the future, applied to the young men. As they had received an inheritance from the past, they must bequeath an inheritance to the future generations, and he urged that, as they assume control of public affairs, they devote to them the same energy and spirit, the same honest, unselfish honesty and suggested virtue of their forefathers.

He closed with an appeal for the formation of high ideals, and the cultivation of a patriotic national feeling.
