HUNGARIAN ARMY OF 70,000 HAS BEEN ORGANIZED

Formed Secretly Under Command of Major Gregory To Attack Allies.

COPENHAGEN, March 23.—The Berlin Lokal Anzeiger's Budapest correspondent says an army of 70,000 men has been formed secretly under the command of Major Gregory. The correspondent adds that the non-Socialists and the rural population are supporting the new government.

Karolyi's Statement. COPENHAGEN, March 23.—(Associated Press).—The proclamation of Count Karolyi announcing the resignation of the Hungarian Cabinet, of which he was the head, after referring to the decision of the peace conference at Paris to occupy Hungarian territory, says, according to a dispatch from Vienna:

"The entire nation declared that it intends to regard the demarcation line as the political frontier. The aim of further military occupation of this country is manifestly to make Hungary the jumping-off ground and the region of operations against the Russian Soviet army, which is fighting on our frontier. The land evacuated by us, however, is to be the pay of the Czech troops, by means of whom the Russian Soviet army is to be overcome."

As provisional president of the Hungarian people's republic, I turn against the Paris peace conference, to the proletariat of the world for justice and support."

WHITE DELAYS BUDGET TILL AFTER EASTER

Tariff Issue Will Be One of Long Suspense.

WAITING FOR THE PREMIER

Canadian Press Dispatch Says Borden Will Retain Leadership For a While.

OTTAWA, March 23.—The general expectation amongst members interested in the tariff issue is that the budget will be presented to Parliament by Sir Thomas White shortly after the Easter recess, which means about the end of April or early in the month of May.

Sir Thomas White is keeping his own counsel in regard to the matter. The minister of finance always announces the date on which the budget will be brought down to the House well in advance.

To Await Borden's Return. Sir Robert Borden is expected to return to Canada about Easter time. The date of his arrival may be later. There is said to be no truth in the report that it is not the prime minister's intention to again assume the office in high office.

Whatever he may decide to do at a later date, it is authoritatively stated that Sir Robert intends to return to Ottawa and again assume the leadership of the Unionists long before the present Parliamentary session is brought to a close.

Appropriation for Year. Sir Thomas White has given notice of the following resolution: "That a sum not exceeding three hundred and fifty million dollars be appropriated to his majesty towards defraying the expenses that may be incurred by or under the authority of the government-in-council during the year ending March 31, 1920."

TWO TRANSPORTS ARE DUE AT HALIFAX ON OR ABOUT THURSDAY

Minnekahda Is Carrying 117 Men For This District.

OVER 6,000 ON THE TWO

Cedric Has 3,520, Made Up of Parts of Several Scattered Units.

OTTAWA, March 23.—The militia department has received by cable the classification by dispersal areas of troops on board the transport Minnekahda, which is due at Halifax on or about March 27. She carries 2,550 soldiers. The classification of Ontario men is as follows:

Ottawa, 10 officers, 3 cadets, 188 other ranks.
Kingston, 2 officers, 2 cadets, 89 other ranks.
Toronto, 41 officers, 14 cadets, 820 other ranks.
Hamilton, no officers, 1 cadet, 1 other rank.
London, 2 officers, 6 cadets, 111 other ranks.
Port Arthur, 2 cadets, 30 other ranks.
Cedric Bringing 3,520.

The transport Cedric, carrying 3,520 Canadian troops, will also probably dock March 27 at Halifax. She is bringing the 8th and 9th Battalions and Engineers for Toronto and the 32d Battery, Ninth Brigade, also for that city. The Montreal draft includes the 25th Battery, and Hamilton draft includes the 31st Battery, the 6th Battery, Eighth Brigade.

Included in the Winnipeg draft is the 35th Battery, Tenth Brigade. The classification of Ontario men on board follows:

Toronto, 54 officers, 2 cadets and 1,595 other ranks.
Hamilton, 13 officers, 507 other ranks.

INSPECTOR AYEART REPORTED RESIGNED; RESULT OF CHARGES

Official Whom Dewar Has Accused Yields Office, Says Paper.

TORONTO, March 23.—The World will say tomorrow: "It is stated in well-informed circles that Chief License Inspector John Ayeart has resigned as a result of the charges laid against him by H. H. Dewar, M.P., in the Legislature last Friday. Members of the Government would make no direct pronouncement on the matter tonight. Up to the time he joined the department Inspector Ayeart had been a Methodist minister in Thamesville. In 1911 Mr. Ayeart left for Edmonton, where he became the head of the Temperance and Moral Reform Association. After two years at this work he returned to his position with the Government."

TO ATTEND CONFERENCE. WINNIPEG, March 23.—F. J. Anderson, president of the Winnipeg Grain Exchange, will go overseas to join Dr. Macdonald as representative of the exchange at the Allied trade conference, where arrangements will be made for the handling of the 1919 crop.

PRISONER MAKES DARING ATTEMPT TO ESCAPE PEN

Raps Guard on Head and Stabs Him Viciously With Kitchen Knife.

TRAPPED BY A CITIZEN

While Providing Desperado With Clothes, Kingston Man Phones For Aid.

KINGSTON, March 23.—Leo Rogers, a young Russian Pole, who is serving a seven-year term for robbery, made a desperate but unsuccessful attempt to escape from penitentiary yesterday afternoon, and as a result of his effort John Barrigan, a penitentiary guard, lies in the Hotel Dieu, seriously wounded.

Yesterday afternoon, about 3 o'clock, Rogers, who had been employed in the prison kitchen, rapped on the west gate, and in reply to a query from Barrigan, who was in charge of the gate, he told him he had a note for him.

The guard opened the gate, and as he did so Rogers hit him on the head with a stick of wood. Barrigan was knocked down, but he quickly got to his feet, and attempted to grapple with the convict, who viciously stabbed him with a knife which he had taken from the kitchen.

A Stab Below Heart. The knife entered Barrigan's left side below the heart, passed through the diaphragm and made an ugly wound in the stomach, which required several stitches. Rogers ran along the outside of the prison wall, passed over the late Senator Richardson's property, and on to the grounds of the Oshana Military Hospital. Here Capt. Morrison tried to intercept him, but he threatened the captain with an axe which he had picked up on the grounds. The captain, being unarmed, naturally made no effort to detain the prisoner.

who after hitting the door of the garage with his axe, crossed the road to the home of J. G. Ettinger. He entered the house by way of the kitchen, went up the back stairs, and when first discovered by a woman in the household, he was standing on the landing at the top of the front stairs.

Demand for Money. When asked what he wanted he replied: "I want money to go to see my mother, who is in the hospital."

Mr. Ettinger, who had been sleeping, was awakened, and succeeded in getting Rogers to go downstairs to the kitchen. Here he exchanged his prison trousers for a pair of overalls and a cloth cap. He had arrived hatless, coatless and bootless. In the meantime Mr. Ettinger had phoned the prison authorities, and with the view of detaining him, was telling Rogers a pair of boots, when George Laturney, the penitentiary accountant, arrived with a drawn revolver.

Throws Up His Hands. As Rogers left the house, Laturney, who was right on his heels, said: "Stop, or I'll put a hole through you."

Rogers, who is only about 18 years old, has served nearly two years of his sentence, until now has never given the slightest trouble. He is closely confined, and will be arraigned in court in a few days. He was born in Liverpool.
