Yield in South West Smaller Than
Expected—Coarse Grains
Strong at Chicago.

ago 7,325,000 bushels.
Modern Millers' Winter wheat threshing
is intermittent, owing to unsettled
weather and frequent rain. In Nebraska
the rain did some damage to wheat in
the shock. Threshing returns show an
irregular yield with many short crops.
The southeast, which has claimed good
average crops reports smaller in yield
than farmers expected. The largest pro-
portion of the wheat threshed is ex-
cellent in quality and heavy in weight. Most
farmers are not disposed to sell.


