### BALL GAME AND RACE TO TAKE PLACE TO-DAY

Big Event Was Called Off Yesterday Much to the Disappointment of a Large Crowd.

Owing to the peculiar atmospheric conditions which prevailed yesterday, it was thought advisable to postpone the opening of the baseball season and the 3-mile race between Fred Appleby and Fred Simpson until today.

At 11:45 a.m. the Rosedale grounds were in tip-top condition for both the ball game and the big race, but a small-sized blizzard that had been threatening all morning broke loose at that hour, and for an hour and a half raged incessantly. The gates were opened at 1 o'clock, but in view of the conditions, it was considered better policy to shut them again and have the double attraction to-day, when better weather is promised.

All afternoon the sun shone and snow fell intermittently, and if the original program had been proceeded with it would have been disagreeable for both spectators and athletes alike. The infield dried quickly, and at 2 o'clock Manager Kelley examined the turf and said his men could play ball splendidly, but before any arrangements could be made the field was covered with snow again. This happened several times during the afternoon.

The day track, over which Appleby and Simpson were to run, suffered most from the frequent snowfalls. Thursday night Appleby made a half-mile trial and pronounced the track one of the fastest he had ever run, but yesterday it became soft and sticky and entirely unsuitable for running.

There will be no postponement of the race to-day for any cause, and it will commence at 3:30, with the same officials as announced, with Controller Gey as starter and Joe Kelley as referee.

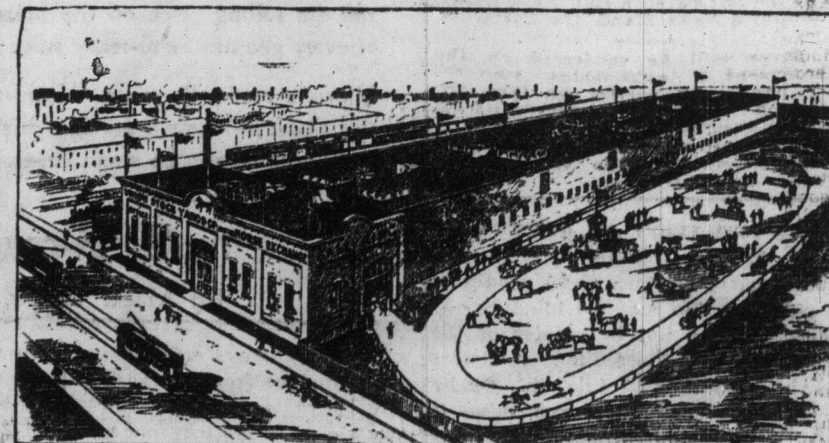
