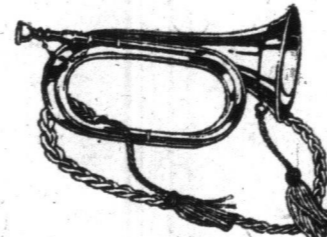

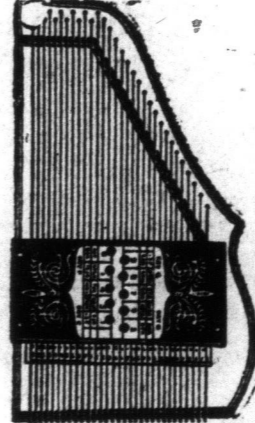
The Mandolin, with its lively tingle and sweet tone, is very popular and easy to learn, and would make a splendid gift for big boy or girl.



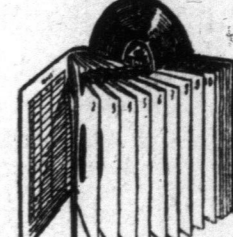
