13,503 Men Since November, 1915
Flavelle's Answer
Read In House,
But Out of Order

New Brunswick's Contribution—
Only 343 in July—News of the Soldiers

The total recruits for July in New Brunswick were 343, making a total of 13,503 men from this province since November, 1915.

London, July 31.—According to official figures today the British casualties on all theatres of the war for July totals 71,832. This is considered below the average since the British have lengthened their line as last year's total for the month of July was more than 100,000, while June's figures were around 100,000.

Under Federal Army
Lieutenant-Colonel J. L. McAvity, who is at present lecturing at the state school of instruction in Massachusetts, says in a letter to Captain May of this city, that it is likely that St. John officers will be employed by the federal United States army. The colonel expects to be home on August 8 for the war anniversary.

Ottawa, July 31.—The action of G. W. Kite, Liberal member for Richmond (N. S.), in repeating a rumor "that ships carrying munitions to England were being used to give the William Davies Company facilities for shipping its bacon to the old country," brought an answer from Sir Joseph Flavelle today. Just before the orders of the day were called Sir George Foster rose, explaining that he had been asked by the chairman of the munitions board to read a letter in reference to Mr. Kite's statement.

G. W. Kite, is reported in the morning papers as stating that "facilities for the carrying of bacon from the William Davies Company to England, were afforded largely by ships carrying munitions across to Great Britain during the past year," the inference apparently being that I secured some preferred relation for the William Davies Company for the movement of bacon products to Great Britain.

"It should be an adequate reply to state that the William Davies Company have been under contract with the imperial authorities to ship a given quantity of bacon each week the price for which has been fixed by the imperial authorities in Great Britain.

"For such contract bacon the minister of shipping in Great Britain arranges for transportation and instructs the director of overseas transport in Canada to provide space for it. As the movement of this bacon overseas is wholly under the control of the minister of shipping in Great Britain no action is taken by any officer of the William Davies Company to secure space for such shipments.

"For the bacon which is forwarded on consignment to Great Britain the company secures ocean space in the ordinary manner. I am advised that there have been weeks at a time when space for consignment bacon was unobtainable and that there have been other periods when the freight was so extreme that the company did not take the space. In any case the company's position was the same as that of any shipper seeking to secure ocean accommodation from the various shipping companies.

"I address this letter to you because I observe that in the proceedings of the house you asked the member for Richmond for his authority for this statement.

There was no comment upon the reading of the letter but later the speaker, having looked up authorities on parliamentary practice, announced that the reading of the letter from persons outside, consigned upon a statement of a member of the house was not in order. He therefore directed that the letter be expunged from the records of the house.

Knox Church Call To Rev. H. C. Fraser Is Sustained

At a special meeting of the Presbytery of St. John held in St. Andrew's church yesterday afternoon at 2.30, Rev. W. M. Townsend being moderator pro tem, a call was presented from the congregation of Knox church, St. John, addressed to Rev. H. C. Fraser, M. A., of Charlottetown (N. B.).

It was supported before the presbytery by Messrs. W. S. Clawson and Douglas McArthur, each of whom testified as to the heartiness and unanimity of the call and to the earnest desire of the congregation that Mr. Fraser should accept the same. The call carries with it a guarantee of \$2,000 stipend and one month's vacation each year and a generous allowance towards moving expenses in the event of the call being accepted.

On motion the call was sustained as a regular gospel call but the congregation was granted further time for a more complete consideration of the call among its members, many of whom are at present at their summer homes and could not be reached in the short time since the meeting at which the call was issued. Provisional arrangements were made for the induction of Mr. Fraser should he accept the call. In the absence of the moderator Rev. J. A. McKelgan was appointed to preside and induct; Rev. T. P. Drummond to address the minister and Rev. J. H. A. Anderson to address the congregation.

The date of the induction is to be agreed upon by the clerk of the presbytery and the interim moderator of the Knox session. The call will be forwarded to the presbytery of Westminister (B. C.), of which Rev. Mr. Fraser is at present a member and some little time will elapse before his decision is given.

Rev. Mr. McKelgan, who had expected to have been present at the meeting yesterday to present the call, was delayed from reaching St. John by the washout on the C. P. R. line to Montreal.
