## ENGLISH-SPEAKING UNION, NOT ENOUGH TO ASSURE PEACE

Rt. Hon. C. J. Doherty Makes Plea for Union of All Nations—Empire Commonwealth.

A union of the English-speaking peoples, as a guarantee of world peace, would not go far enough, declared the Right Hon. C. J. Doherty, formerly Canadian Minister of Justice, in an address last week, before the Bar of the City of New York.

"Why stop there," he said. "Why not take in all peoples and let common justice for all mankind appeal? Those who urge an English-speaking union say: 'Let that come and we will take care of the peace of the world.'"

"But," continued Mr. Doherty, "they could not take care of it only by force in such a way, and we know what that means. World peace requires a machinery which represents all nations."

Mr. Doherty was frank to say that he felt dissatisfied when it was urged upon him as a Canadian that his people and the people of the United States should be impelled to a closer friendship because of the similarity of their languages, their laws and their race. As a matter of fact, Mr. Doherty asked, even though these things might be good reasons for such a friendship, were they the true reasons and were there not other and nobler reasons?

"Our greatest ties," he said, "are our common outlook on life, our common aspirations for the good of humanity. Should not these ties bind us for our own sakes?"

The British Empire, went on Mr. Doherty, had now become a group of self-governing partner nations—a group bound together by the link of common allegiance to the same crown. He declared that in the group none had the power to say, "You shall," much less "You must." It was held together because all members said, "You will."

Domestic Status.  
All the dominions were now equal in status to the mother country, Mr. Doherty said, though in power it was a status which even the men of Ireland, with their deep sense of nationhood, could at least honorably accept.

The world definitely accepted new debuts into international society at the peace conference, when British went accompanied by her dominions because control of the empire's external affairs had passed out of her hands and into the hands of the partnership as a whole. There was no longer the relation of a dominant power to dominated people. The British Empire rested at present upon agreements of partners.

Mr. Doherty emphasized the smoothness with which the partnership organization had been brought about, and was now being conducted, despite automatic laws formerly on the British statute books. He said such laws had been practically nullified wherever they conflicted with the autonomy of such a dominion as Canada.

There were certain legal powers, he continued, possessed by the British parliament by which it could repeal or amend the Canadian constitution, which was in turn derived from the British North America Act. "It simply does not do it. The corollary," the speaker asserted, "might even seem to be that it could also legislate. But as in social circles the phrase 'It isn't done' is a powerful bar, so it is in international circles. We in Canada feel no anxiety from this quarter because, if parliament did seek to use this authority, it would find itself face to face with the insuperable obstacles of the constitutions of its own constitution."

Far-reaching precedent in this matter had already been set, Mr. Doherty asserted, in the naturalization controversy in 1914. When the home government sought to legislate for the empire as a whole, there was a successful appeal to the parliament of the proposed measure by each dominion.

**TYPHUS EPIDEMIC  
SWEEPS RUSSIA**  
Toll in Moscow Seven to Eight Times Larger Than Last Season.

Moscow, Feb. 15.—(By mail.)—Soviet Russia is once more under the shadow of an epidemic wave of typhus fever and recurrent typhus, which has been sweeping since November. The Volga famine area is chiefly affected.

In the centre of Russia the epidemic has invaded the big towns of Moscow and Petrograd, and the surrounding districts, and in the west the cities of Minsk, Smolensk, Witebsk, and in the north, Ologda.

In Moscow itself the epidemic is growing rapidly, and the toll which it is exacting from the Moscow population is already now seven to eight times larger than that of last season and it is feared that before the winter months are over it might well overgrow the epidemic of 1919.

In December over 4,000 cases of typhus were registered in Moscow, while during the first three weeks of January, 4,750 cases were registered in hospitals. But the number of cases is much higher than this figure.

The epidemic shows no decline and death casualties are not below forty per cent.

Motor cars to the number of 41,292 were during the year 1921 exported from the United States. Of this number, Latin American countries took 33.1 per cent.; British North America, 15.4 per cent.; Asiatic countries, 14.5 per cent.; Europe, 13.1 per cent.; Oceania, 11.1 per cent.; non-contiguous territory of the States, 8.8 per cent.; Africa, 8.7 per cent.

Of the 13,729 cars exported to Latin America, 10,207, or 74.5 per cent., went to Mexico and Cuba, 454, or 3.3 per cent., to Central America, the West Indies exclusive of Cuba, and Porto Rico, and 2,068, or 15 per cent., to South American countries. Except for twelve cars going to Newfoundland and Labrador, all the shipments to British North America (6,898) went to Canada.

**MOTOR SQUADRONS  
OF POLICEMEN WILL  
SCOUR N.Y. STREETS**

New York, March 22.—The circulation of motor squadrons of policemen through the streets of the city every evening in the twenty-four, and the use of "mopping-up" parties of detectives who are to clear one section after another by arresting suspicious persons and ex-convicts, are announced as a new feature of the police campaign against the crimes of violence, which were numerous again today.

Seventy-two motor cars with a sergeant and six policemen in each car, will begin their tours tomorrow equipped with strong searchlights and heavy armaments. These fast moving police groups are expected to sweep the streets of criminals, and to be always within easy signalling from policemen and detectives on foot need help in the pursuit of criminals.

The "mopping-up" of the streets by police infantry was a method put into effect tonight in Greenwich village by detectives from the Charles street police station who were sent out to arrest anybody who looked suspicious or had a criminal record. During the night they arrested seven men who looked as if they might have guilty consciences. They were held in jail while the detectives searched for more concrete evidence. Shootings, stabbings and holdups were among the crimes reported today, and the practice of riding in taxicabs to lonely spots and then holding up the chauffeur began to assume the proportions of a fad.

**PICKS CARTRIDGE  
WITH PIN, 5 HURT**

Village School Thrown Into Panic by Explosion—Boy Loses Fingers of One Hand

Perth Amboy, N. J., March 22.—Five children were injured and twenty-five others were thrown into a panic when a large cartridge, probably for an army rifle, exploded in a room of a public school at Perth, two miles west of here. Robert Kovacs, thirteen years old, of William street, Perth, who was handling the cartridge when it exploded, was so severely cut on the thumb, index finger and second finger of his left hand that they had to be amputated at the Perth Amboy City Hospital.

Others injured were: Bessie Wilson of Perth, badly bruised; Mary Zick of Perth, bruised and cut on legs; Margaret Quish of Keaney, arms bruised; and Louis Tzofovich of Keaney, legs cut and bruised.

Kovacs is said to have told that he found the cartridge in a field near a road leading from a government arsenal. He did not know what it was, he said, and took it into the school room. He began to pick at it with a pin and it exploded. The desks and books on it were damaged. Pieces of wood and fragments of the cartridge hit the other children wounded.

The uninjured pupils were highly excited and rushed from the room. Miss P. A. Nash, a nurse, gave first aid to all but Kovacs and they went home.

It is probable that the accident will result in investigation by the County Board of Freeholders. Many children have been hurt by explosions of cartridges which they found along the roads and in the fields, but this is the first time an explosion has injured more than one child. The cartridges are believed to have been dropped by vehicles of salvagers concerned that more explosives from the Raritan Arsenal, about four miles away.

There are about 120 pupils in the Perth School. When the news of the accident began to spread, many mothers hurried there to ascertain whether their children had been hurt.
