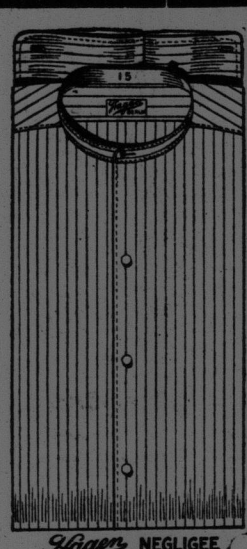

This is inexpensive and easily made at home—1 just dissolve 4 ounces sprumax in 1-2 pint witch hazel or hot water, then add 2 teaspoonfuls glycerine, and it is ready. I apply this lotion sparingly and rub lightly for a moment until it dries and seems to become a part of the skin, to which it gives a velvety smoothness and refined color that is delightful. O. T.—The wrinkles of which you speak will soon vanish if you apply a plain almond cream-jelly and massage the long way of the creases. This simple treatment tends to vivify the dormant tissues, causing the creases or lines to fill out. To prepare the cream-jelly, put 1 ounce almond (which you can get at your drug store) in 1-2 pint water and add 2 teaspoonfuls glycerine. Let remain over night before using. SAYS IMMIGRANTS HELD IN QUARANTINE ARE ILL TREATED

Montreal Man Receives Letter From One Held at Grosse Isle, Complaining of Lack of Food and Other Things.

Montreal, June 15—Letters declaring that nearly 300 immigrants from the steamship Canada, detained at the quarantine station at Grosse Isle, are being ill-treated and underfed have been received by S. Kysalis, of 298 Roy street, from relatives among the passengers. The letters begged him to send food and Canadian money, as Russian money was refused by officials in charge. The question of quarantine at Grosse Isle does not come within the jurisdiction of the Montreal officials. At the local immigration offices it was stated that the facts of the case must have been greatly exaggerated, and that some minor discomforts, unavoidable under the circumstances, had probably been magnified by the letter writer in a fit of annoyance caused by his detention. On Monday, June 8, nearly 300 steerage passengers were landed at Grosse Isle, following the discovery of the case of smallpox and one of measles on the Dominion liner Canada.

MORNING NEWS OVER THE WIRE

A statistical report laid before the aldermen of the city of Montreal yesterday showed that the city had spent nearly \$100,000,000 in four years. The plural voting bill passed its third reading in the British house of commons last evening.

William Windsor, an Indian, 28 years of age, was struck by a train while walking on the I. C. R. track near Campbellton on Sunday. He died a few hours afterwards.

A valuable female patch fox was stolen from the farm of W. H. Miller, Campbellton, on Saturday morning.
