In the glorious old castle, high up on the wooded slopes of the river Ruhr, where he makes his principal residence, he has a great work-room, immediately adjoining his bed-room, and may be found there at all hours of the day and night, directing his vast operations. His life is of the simplest. In fact, it might almost be described as austere, and nobody has ever seen him in a suit of clothes that could have cost more than \$20. Very reticent, he never talks unless he has something to say, and this he says with a minimum expenditure of vocabulary. Yet he speaks several of the foreign languages with remarkable fluency, notably English. He is very good to his army of workmen, but declines to coddle them, but shuns society, loves Nature, is deeply religious, and a devout member of the Catholic Church He received his business training at Antwerp, where he spent his early days. His one great sorrow in life is his feud with his son, August, who has been twice bankrupted, with debts of some \$12,000,000, and who has served sentences in prison, both for duelling and for libelling some of his father's friends and chief lieutenants.
