The Centenary of Matthew Arnold

(Toronto Globe.)

Matthew Arnold's centenary just passed, has attracted considerable attention to the "apotheosis of wit and wit" the British poet, critic and inspector of schools who aimed at the highest standard in thought, method and conduct. As the son of the celebrated Dr. Arnold of Rugby, he was born in an academic atmosphere, and he lived in the same kind of environment, though he was able to retain originality and freshness. He might have succumbed to the conditions he detected in Tennyson, who he said, wrote "distilled thoughts in distilled words," as contrasted with Homer's "natural thoughts in natural words." One might imagine such a man to have an aloof and spiritual appearance, but this was not the case. Those who formed their ideas of Arnold's personality from their knowledge of his "culture" and especially those who have been delighted by the delicacy of his prose style, were bewildered when, for the first time, they met him at a dinner table or in a friend's smoking-room. "Those who had been captivated by his poetry," wrote Theodore Watts-Dunton, "expected to find a man whose sensitive organism responded to every uttered word as an aeolian harp answers to the faintest breeze. What they found was a broad-shouldered, manly—almost burly—Englishman with a fine countenance bronzed by the open

air of England, wrinkled apparently by sun, wind-worn as an English skipper's, open and frank as a fox-hunting squire's—and yet a countenance whose finely chiselled features were as high-bred and as commanding as Wellington's or Sir Charles Napier's. The voice he heard was deep-toned, fearless, rich and full, particularly suited to express every nuance of thought, every movement of emotion and humor.

Despite his thirty-five years of employment as an inspector of schools from which he spared what time he could for literary work, Arnold was a prominent figure in the great galaxy of Victorian poets, with Tennyson, Browning, Rossetti, William Morris and Swinburne as contemporaries. His style was his own and some of his phrases are well established. There is the sonnet on Shakespeare, beginning:

Others abide our question, Thou art free, We ask and ask, Thou smiles and art still, Out-topping knowledge.

There is the line of Sophocles, who "saw life steadily and saw it whole"; that upon Shelley "beating in the void his luminous wings in vain"; and the lines that open with "Goethe in Wilmersleepe" and close in the apostrophe on Wordsworth's grave—these are imperishable parts in English literature.

\$100,000 FOR MAUSOLEUM

(Toronto Telegram.) A notable addition to Toronto's artistic memorials to the dead is the new mausoleum erected by the widow of Sir Frank Baillie. It has been erected in Mount Pleasant Cemetery, close to the Sir John Eaton and Senator Cox mausoleums—on the southeastern section.

The Baillie Mausoleum, which cost \$100,000, has just been completed. It is not exceptionally large, and its lines are rather severe, yet the structure is of unusual beauty, fronted by steps and a solid copper door of rich design. The basic material is white marble. Messrs. Spragg and Rolph are the architects.

Sir Frank W. Baillie, K.C.B.E., widely known man of affairs, was given his title in 1918. He attracted attention during the war by voluntarily returning business profits to the Government. He was born in Toronto in 1875, and died some two years ago.
