MANY SEE CHORUS GIRL AT OPERA HOUSE; ENJOY PLAY GREATLY

Large Audience Attends the First Presentation of Stock Company's Bill For This Week

Because a girl happens to be a member of the "merry, merry" or because she sings and dances in the chorus of "The Moonlight Maids" or other such musical comedies, does not imply that she is deserving of all the harsh things sometimes said of chorus girls. That was shown plainly last evening at the Opera House in the presentation of Rose Stahl's great success "The Chorus Lady" by the Thompson-Woods Stock Co. to a large and appreciative audience. Incidentally it was shown that the life of the chorus girl is not all one gay round of pleasure.

In the title role, that of Patricia O'Brien, Miss Brandt won further laurels for her histrionic crown. She arose to every demand made of her, and it was in many places a very trying role. She lived the life of the pretty chorus lady, slung to a remarkable degree, and ignorant in the knowledge of schools, but most wise in the ways of the world, and both in the gay scenes, then no trouble seemed to present itself, and in the strongly dramatic parts where powerful emotion was required, Miss Brandt gracefully and easily responded to the demands of the role. She bore the burden of the play herself, for it is distinctly a one-woman show, and the hearty applause which greeted her was most heartily deserved.

Miss Marjorie Davis, the ingenue of the company, who has become very popular here, was sweet and winsome as "Pat's" innocent sister, untutored to the scenes and puffs of the chorus life and though her role was not altogether pleasing, she made herself particularly available to the audience.

Miss Bridges had a very likeable role as the old Irish mother, with her big, good-natured heart showing itself in her every act and word, and especially in her love for her daughters and she gave a very pleasing rendition, also contributing to much of the comedy. The other ladies in the cast, Misses Delmore, Great Bishop, Derby, Walker, and Baird, the latter both of St. John, all made much for the success of the piece.

Mr. McHenry took the most out of a part which did not call for a display of the ability which he has proven himself to possess and as Dan Malloy, a young admirer of "Patricia" with a true Irish heart, he made an admirable sweetheart.

CANADA'S PEAT INDUSTRY

"Canada's peat industry has become an economic factor of considerable importance. It has passed beyond the experimental stage and is now on a basis for extensive development," writes J. G. Adams, B. A. in this week's issue of the Journal of Commerce, Montreal in an illustrated article on Canada's Peat Industry.

The writer shows that last year Canada imported more than fourteen and a half million tons of coal valued at nearly \$40,000,000 or a per capita expenditure for this one import alone of more than \$6. In Canada already more than 40,000 acres of peat bog have been surveyed and explored "but there is an almost incalculable amount of peat between the Atlantic and the Pacific, much of it still unknown. Over this area the peat averages possibly twenty feet in depth and when it is remembered that one acre of peat one foot deep will yield approximately 200 tons or that an acre twenty feet deep will yield about 4,000 tons one may understand, in some small degree the importance and value of this almost unlimited supply of fuel.

TEACHING THE YOUNG IDEA

(Vancouver Province.)
Oregon is showing the way for the right sort of child labor, pleasant and profitable for the little folk and full of promise for the agricultural uplift of the community. In competition for prizes offered by the state educational authorities and citizens, 50,000 children got busy raising garden truck, chickens or pigs, and this autumn the state and county fairs have had exhibits from 75,000 of Oregon's school population of 128,000. Printed bulletins of instruction are issued by the state agricultural colleges, rising generation of farmers may solve the cost of living problem. Here is something worth a trial in other places.
