New York, Sept. 23.—Johnny Buff, of Jersey City, United States flyweight champion, won the world's bantamweight title tonight when he received the judges' decision over Pete Herman, of New Orleans, at the end of their fifteen round bout. Buff weighed 113½ pounds and Herman 117¾ pounds. Buff brought the crowd to its feet time and again by his lightning-like work and aggressiveness. He had the better of ten rounds, four were Herman's and one was even.

The first preliminary bout was stopped in the first round after Johnny Murray had been floored thrice for a count of nine by "Red Cap" Wilson, Batling Ready, 125, of New York, and Terry McHugh, 121½ pounds, received the judges' decision in his eight-round fight with Irish Johnny Curtin, 122 pounds.

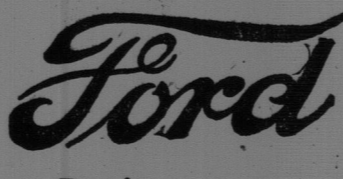
U. N. B. Writes for Games.
