The Bronze Medal presented by His Excellency the Governor-General, is awarded to the boy who obtains the highest place in Mathematics at the June Examination.

The Chancellor's Prize is awarded to the head boy of the School, according to the result of the Midsummer Examination.

A Bronze Medal, presented by the late Mrs. Perram and Mrs. Gaviller, is awarded annually, by vote of the Masters, to the boy who has chiefly distinguished himself by "Steady Perseverance in Industry, Courtesy and Integrity."

A Prize offered by the Head Master for the best Collection in any department of Natural Science, made by any boy during the course of the School year, is awarded at the end of the Summer Vacation.

E. Martin, Esq., Q.C., of Hamilton, offers a Prize for Classics to be awarded to the boy in the Fifth Form who obtains, at the Midsummer Examination, the highest total number of marks in Latin and Greek Grammar, Authors and Composition, on condition that his marks amount to two-thirds of the whole.

Edwin Rogers, Esq., offers the Prize for General Proficiency in the highest Form at the Christmas Examination.

Mr. J. E. Birch, Organist of Christ Church Cathedral, Montreal, and Mr. F. H. Coombs, offer for competition two Prizes in Music, one for the Tenors and Basses in the Choir, the other for the Trebles and Altos. The examination is held on the Rudiments of Music as contained in Cummings's Primer, and ability to read easy passages at sight.
