THE BAY ROUTE.

The steamer Yarmouth, now receiving an extensive overhauling at Halifax will take up the morning trip of the Digby-St. John service about the 10th of June, when the St. George will perform the afternoon service.

ICE IS OPENING.

A wireless message states that at 6 o'clock on the 22nd the S. S. Marina was 52 miles east southeast of the Punks, Nfld., and that the ice was opening. The Marina is bound to Bowwood.

CAPTAIN WASHED OVERBOARD.

The Nova Scotia schooner Carrie M. Wambach, dimasted January 13, in longitude 60, latitude 27, her captain washed overboard, and later abandoned by her crew, is now a derelict and menace to trans-Atlantic shipping in latitude 40.30 N., longitude 56.35 W.

SCHOONER ASHORE.

The Nova Scotia schooner Alice Gertrude went ashore at Seal Island on Sunday, and she is in a dangerous position. The crew were all rescued. The Gertrude was built at Larkins in 1902, and is 31 tons register. She is owned by L. Clow, of Shelburne, and is insured in Halifax.

MAN, INVENTOR REPAIRED.

A Montreal despatch says: After having a number of her bow plates rivetted and another propeller fixed to replace the one damaged in her trip here from England, the "Manche" inventor is again ready to go to sea and will sail within the next few days.

STEAMER CHARTERED.

Spanish steamer, 1959 tons, Canada to the United Kingdom, private terms, June.

The tern schooner Inga, Capt. Hayward, is chartered of load lumber at Gold River, N. S., for New Bedford. From there she comes to Annapolis in ballast to load lumber for Barbados and back to Halifax with molasses.

EASTERN LINERS.

The full summer schedule of the International division of the Eastern Steamship Corporation went into effect yesterday when the three trip per week service commenced, the boats leaving here on Monday, Wednesday and Friday afternoons for Boston. The service will be performed for the present by the steamers Governor Cobb and Calvin Austin. The latter has lately been undergoing repairs at Boston.

ENTIRE CREW LOST.

Charlottetown, P. E. I., May 27.—The schooner which foundered off Carleton Point, in Monday's gale with all on board was the Abana, eighty tons, built in Shelburne, N. B., 15 years ago. She was bound from Pictou to Summerside with coal for the P. E. Island railway. A body found at Cape Traverse Tuesday has been identified as Capt. James Langin, of Souris, aged 65, owner of the vessel.

Three other men lost with the vessel also belonged to Souris: Joseph Lane, aged 55; Aza Blaisdell, aged 75; and Wilson, aged twenty.

Langin leaves a widow and grown up family; and Lane a widow and large family of small children. The others were unmarried.

Only one body has been so far recovered.

New York, May 26.—Stmr Prinz Friedrich Wilhelm (Ger), from Bremen, reports May 22, lat. 41 15, lon. 46 03, passed an iceberg about 75 feet high.

Stmr Saxo (Br), from Bordeaux, reports May 20, lat. 41 45, lon. 48 10, passed a large iceberg and later, in lat. 41 45, saw five smaller ones.

Stmr Matanzas reports May 25, lat. 38 25 N, lon. 74 W, passed a broken boom, with rigging attached, about 40 feet long.

Stmr Prinz August Wilhelm (Ger), New York for Colon, reports May 25, lat. 37 30, lon. 74, passed a large broken lifeboat, painted white; no name on it.




