#### Better Water and Sewerage Service for the Residents of Lancaster Was Discussed—Other Business Transacted.

Better water and sewerage service for the residents of the Parish of Lancaster was the main theme before the city council at the committee meeting yesterday morning. A delegation composed of J. M. Queen, Councillor John O'Brien, H. Mont Jones, Fred Henderson, George Armstrong, Thomas Armstrong, Dr. J. H. Barton, Dr. J. V. Anglin and James McMurray was present. After the delegation had placed their views on the matter before the council, Commissioner Jones expressed himself as favorable to the extension of the 36-inch main to Spruce Lake at an estimated cost of \$300,000 but no definite action was taken.
