AMENDMENT TO PROVIDE AUTHORITY TO MAKE RULES RESPECTING FEES— REPORT STAGE

Motion (for concurrence) agreed to.

Mr. Deputy Speaker: When shall the said bill be read a third time? By leave now?

Some hon. Members: By leave now.

Mr. Basford moved that the bill be read the third time and do pass.

Mr. James A. McGrath (St. John's East): Mr. Speaker, may I ask the government house leader, while the Minister of Consumer and Corporate Affairs (Mr. Basford) is in his seat, whether the government intends at the next sitting of the house to give consideration to the area covered by consumer and corporate affairs? In respect of this department, we find ourselves having to deal with a number of standing committees of the house and I believe this to be an unsatisfactory arrangement.

Hon. Donald S. Macdonald (President of the Privy Council): This might be an appropriate subject for discussion when we consider reconstructing Standing Order 65 with regard to committees. I would be prepared to take up this matter with my colleagues on all sides of the house.
