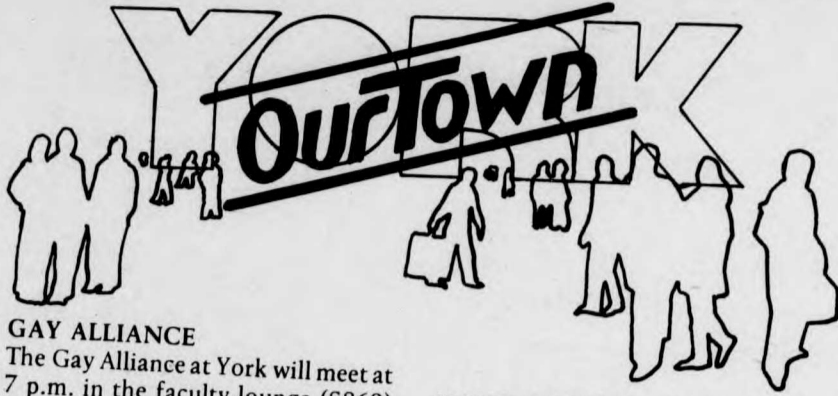
TEENAGE HEAD
