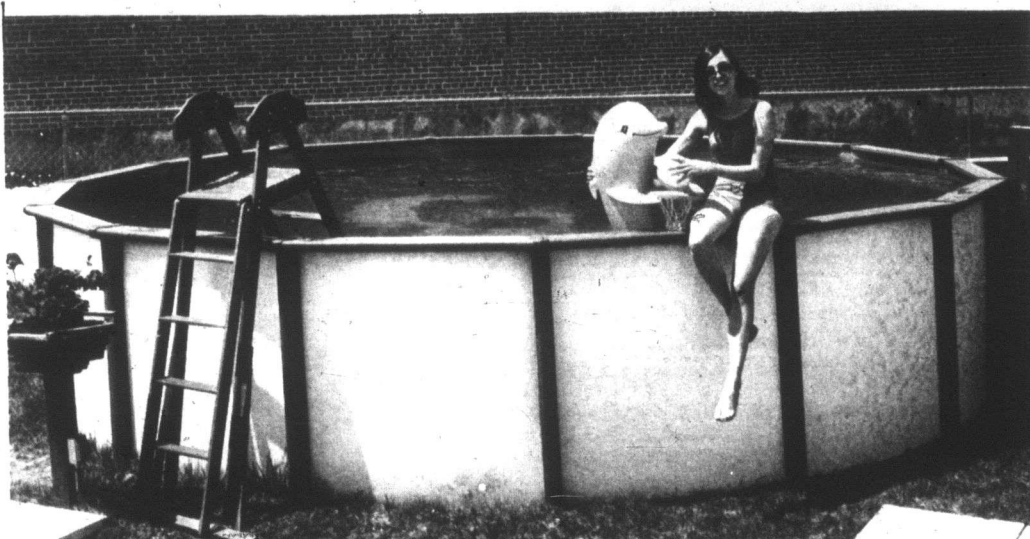
PICNIC

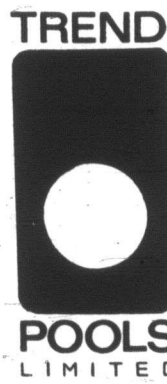
