The Committee of the Privy Council have had before them a report, dated 28th March, 1924, from the Minister of Public Works, submitting as follows:

That the Canadian High Commissioner's offices in London, England, were for many years housed in a rented building at 17 Victoria Street, lease of which expired on June 24, 1923. There are also a number of Canadian Government offices in London which are housed in various parts of the city, as the premises at 17 Victoria Street were too small to accommodate them;

That pending negotiations for a permanent building temporary quarters for the High Commissioner's offices were secured in Kinnaird House, Pall Mall East, London, S.W.1.;

As a result of endeavours to secure headquarters in London which would be a credit to the Dominion of Canada, by an agreement of sale dated June 26, 1923, a building was offered to the Dominion Government which, with certain alterations, it is thought, will fully meet the requirements and accommodate all its activities in London. The building is known as the UNION CLUB and is situated at the corner of Trafalgar Square and Cockspur Street. It is a four-storey building with basement and has a frontage of about 90 feet to Cockspur Street and about 118 feet to
