It would appear under the circumstances that the 231 915 Department must leave you after a full consideration of the probable consequential effect, to the exercise of your own judgment as to what course to, pursue, but it of course has no authority to govern the Royal North West Mounted Police Force with regard to prosecuting or refraining from so doing.
