

Ottawa, January 30, 1907.

Sir,-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 19th instant, inclosing copies of resolutions passed by the Council of the Munceys of the Thames requesting permission for James Wolfe to cut and remove timber from his Location about three acres in area, also for Mrs. Lucy Nicholas to cut and sell timber on the E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the S.  $\frac{1}{2}$  of Lot 6, Range 5, Caradoc, and in reply to inform you that the cutting of timber on Locations should always be done adjoining clearings instead of on selected places in different parts of the lots, unless good and sufficient reasons are shown to the contrary.

If these applications are in accord with this description, you may issue free Permits to cut such limited quantities as you approve on the conditions stated in the letter sent you on the 16th ultimo.
