
Sir,-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 26th instant, inclosing applications of Noel Ginnish and Peter Sock of Burnt Church Reserve for permission to cut 2,000 pieces each of Spruce, on Tabusintac Reserve, Pine, Fir and Cedar, and in reply to inform you that permits may be issued to cut the 4,000 pieces, provided that the Reserve is well timbered and that sufficient timber would remain to supply the wants of the Band, and that dues at tariff rates be collected under sworn returns.

It is understood from the Chiefs' report of meeting that the total number is to be divided among Indians of the Band, and no further number will be cut and sold.

Inclosed you will receive four copies of tariff approved by Order in Council of 13th October, 1910.
