Mr. A. W. Neill, M.P., sent to Mr. King, to read,

part of a letter received from Mrs. Neill's brother

who, like herself, was a second cousin of Lyon

Mackenzie, of Edinburgh.

"Sheriff Lyon Mackenzie, a second cousin of Jeanie and us, passed away in May last, and I went to Dundee with the Edinburgh friends to Western cemetery.

Mr. King told me once he called upon him occasionally when in Scotland, but on his last visit to England he did not get to Scotland. I think he phoned from London. There was some distant relationship between them.

The Sheriff's father made a lot of money in bleaching, being a partner with Cargill & Co., besides being Manager of Royal Bank, Dundee - this combination would not be allowed nowadays.

The Sheriff left \$56,000 all to one niece in Sydney. \*
