- Q. Pte. Bell there are a few questions that I would like to ask you in order that the court may have a clearer understanding as to the circumstances of your case, the first one is, would you tell the court the particulars about your joining the army?
- A. Well, I enlisted on May 15th, 1942, with the hope I may be of some help to the war.
- Q. What was your age at that time?
- A. Not eighteen, a day before my 18th birthday.
- Q. You enlisted where?
- A. Lindsay, Ont.
- Q. Did you take your training at Lindsay?
- A. No, Sir, I took it... I went to Kingston, Fort Frontenac, and was stationed there for a month.
- Q. You haven't answered the question, did you take your basic training there?
- A. No, I didn't.
- Q. Your training was taken where?
- A. At Cornwall.
- Q. Did you complete your basic training?
- A. Yes, I did.
- Q. What were the conditions at your home at that time, after completing your basic training?
- A. While in training and before joining the army
  my father had not been well, I had always helped
  at home, my mother, she was not in the best of
  health either, in joining the army I thought I
