

Catalogues of the Books contained in the Library shall be placed for reference in the Library, which shall be scientifically arranged.

The Committee shall have power to fine, suspend, or expel any member who shall remove any book, newspaper, or other property of the Institution, contrary to rule, or without due permission.

No member shall be allowed to write or make any remark on any of the books or newspapers belonging to the Library, or otherwise deface or injure them, or damage other property of the Institution; and every member shall be responsible for whatever injury any volume may sustain while in his possession, or for its loss.

Silence and decorum must be preserved in the Reading Room.

That all Newspapers and Periodicals shall be voted in at the half-yearly General Meeting.

The Committee shall cause the Secretary to exhibit a list of papers, etc., seven days previous to the day of meeting, such publication being considered as a nomination for their election.

Any two members wishing to have any Newspaper or Periodical added to or taken off the List of Papers in the room, must post a notice containing the title of such papers, etc., along with their own names, at least seven days previous to the half-yearly General Meeting.

The List of Papers, as voted in, shall remain in a conspicuous place in the Reading Room from one General Meeting to the other.

Trustees.

The Trustees of this Institution shall be the President of the Grand Trunk Railway, Board of Direction, and the Locomotive Superintendent.

Library.

The Library shall be open every lawful day for one hour for exchanging books.

No member shall have more than one volume at a time, unless the plates belonging to it are in a separate volume, in which case both may be taken out at the same time, but must be returned at the expiration of the time allowed for one volume; exception to this Rule may be made by the special permission of the Committee.

A member on returning a book shall not take out the same again, until it has remained one clear day in the Library, nor then if it is wanted by any other member.

When H. R. H. the Prince of Wales visited the Works at Point St. Charles in 1861, he left with the Directors of the Grand Trunk Railway the sum of \$440 for the benefit of the employees. Mr. Blackwell consulted with the other Directors at a General Meeting, and they, by mutual consent, handed the said amount over to the Committee of the "Literary and Scientific Institute," to be expended in the purchase of Books.
