- 13, The counties and electoral divisions enumeratin articles 9, 10, 11 and 12 are those which existed on the 1st of July 1899 for purposes of representation in the 1 gislative Assembly of the Province of Quebec with the thin the assigned to them respectively.
- 14.—Besides the other conditions required under the laws, every governor representing any of the elector divisions mentioned in the foregoing articles must have a likely office in the division which he represents and be likely expressed by members of the College having their offices in such division.
- 15. Every governor who has been elected must, u der the penalty of forfeiting his office IPSO FACTO, a tain during his entire term of office the quality of mer ber of the College and have his office in the elect division which he represents.
- 16. The manner and process of the aforesaid eletions are determined in the by-laws of the Provincial M dical Board, in the absence of which by-laws, the Lieu Governor may fix the date and prescribe the manner cholding such elections.
