

THE QUEBEC TRANSCRIPT.

Commercial.

London, 4th July.—No further measures have been adopted by the Bank of England in reference to the existing state of the Exchange and their bullion; at least no notice was posted after the Court broke up this afternoon, although the general impression in the city was that the rate of discount would at once have been raised to 6 per cent. Every thing, therefore, remains in statu quo, and scarcely any business has been transacted to day, either at the Stock Exchange or elsewhere. Consols are still at 85, to 1/2 for the opening; Three per cent. reduced, 92, to 1/2; ditto, Three and a Half per Cent. 99, to 1/2; and Exchequer Bills, 25 to 27 prem. Bank Stock is 191 to 192, which is an advance of £1.

Remarks on the London Markets.

**SUGAR.**—The total sales during the week were under 1000 hhds. and fierces, for which prices must again be reduced 6d. per cwt. generally, with, however some hesitation on the part of a few of the large houses to meet the market. The public sale have offered 130 hhds. Barbadoes, and 30 Tobago, of which about one half only was sold, and that at a reduction of 6d. per cwt; the former at 64s. 6d. to 68s. 6d. The arrivals last week were 7000 hhds. and 1/2.

The Gazette average price of West India Muscovado Sugar, for the week ending 18th June, is computed at 41s. 6d. per cwt. in bond, and the corresponding week last year it was 33s. 6d. per cwt.

In Refined Sugar the market continues in a dull state, grocers taking only sufficient to supply their immediate wants, and prices are rather lower; standard lumps have been sold at 81s.

In West India Molasses the purchases have not been large, but previous prices have ruled; fine Antigua has sold at 31s. to 36s. and fair St. Lucia and Nevis at 32s. 6d. per cwt.

**TEA.**—There was a good muster of the trade at the sales which took place last week. The bulk of the Tea offered was imported by the General Palmer and Alexander Baring. The merchants refusing to sell excepting at the rates established at the last sale, occasioned the demand to be limited, and not above 3500 out of 21,000 packages offered, found buyers at previous rates.

**SPIRITS.**—The Rum market has again been brisk, and a large business done at a further advance of 1d. per gallon for strong qualities; yesterday and to-day, however, there seems to be less desire to purchase, but prices are very firmly maintained. The transactions in Jamaica are about 250 puns. 26 to 29 over proof, at 5s. 10d. to 5s. 11d., 30 to 34 over at 6s. to 6s. 1d.; 35 to 38 over at 6s. 2d. to 6s. 4d.; a parcel of 26 over proof, of superior quality, sold at 6s.

**IRON.**—The few operations in East India descriptions are at about former rates, and the market is quiet. The sales commence on the 5th inst.

**TAN, &c.**—A cargo of about 600 barrels Stockholm has been sold at 16s. 9d. per bbl. Rosin is lower.

GRAIN MARKET.

London, July 1.—Wheat has advanced 1s. per qr. at most of the markets held on Saturday. The show of English Wheat at Mark Lane, was very scanty this morning, and the best parcels were taken off by the mill owners at 1s. to 2s. per qr. above the rates of Monday last, and secondary kinds sold more freely at fully the terms of that day.

There was little Foreign Wheat fresh up, and having in addition to a good local demand, a fair attendance of buyers from different parts of the country, the business transacted was rather extensive; the best samples must be quoted 1s. to 2s. per qr. dearer, but inferior sorts, of which the bulk of the stock now consists, were offered at former rates.

Fresh ground flour was held for trifling advance, and in some instances a rather more advance was realized.

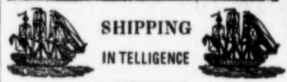
