GOSSIP.

About 2 miles south-west of Gore Bay,
on Manitoulin Island, lies Poplar Grove
stock farm, the property of Mr. Edwin
Beck, breeder of Shorthorn cattle. Mr.
Beck is one of the progressive, up-to-
date, go-ahead farmers of the Island,
who believes in the policy of improve-
ment, and having a splendid, as well as
extensive, farm there, on which is erect-
ed a modern bank barn, he decided a
couple of years ago to establish a herd
of pure-bred Shorthorns, and to that
end purchased the following choice ani-
mals: Ruby Jane 24847, by Collynie
Prince 18231; dam Lady Seaforth
24443, by Lovelia Knight 18234. She is a
big, straight-built roan cow, and has
a one-year-old heifer, by Gordon Prince,
that is the making of something good.
Nelly Booth 23790, by Imp. General
Booth; dam Lady Grant 9502, by Duke
of Kent, is another extra good red cow,
one of the low-down, beely kind, and has
a one-year-old bull by Gordon Prince.
A full sister of hers is Aggie Booth
2307, also an extra good cow. She,
too, has an eight-months-old bull calf
by Gordon Prince. Another half-sister
is Mina May 26451, by Imp. General
Booth; dam Isabella Broughton 15842,
by Favorite 4853, an Isabella-bred cow
and a good one. Minnie Moss 2nd is
sired by Imp. Indian Chief; dam Minnie
Moss, by Imp. Premier. She is a
big, beely animal, of straight-line build,
and belongs to the Morlina family.
Gordon Rose is sired by Ivanhoe 25020;
dam Nellie Booth. She, also, is an ex-
tra nice type of cow. These cows are
now all in calf to Imp. Royal Emperor,
a Marr-bred bull, of the Roan Lady
family. Mr. Beck's choice of foundation
animals shows that he is determined to
rise to a high position among Short-
horn breeders, for all these animals are
up-to-date and in prime condition.

Nine miles from Campobello and
twelve miles from Brighton, in the
County of Northumberland, Ont., lies
Valley farm, the property of Mr. A. B.
Armstrong, whose P. O. address is Cod-
rington, breeder of Improved Yorkshire
hogs, high-class poultry, and Collie dogs.
At the head of Mr. Armstrong's exten-
sive herd of Yorkshires is the boar,
Summer Hill Model 4691, bred by D. C.
Flatt; sired by Imp. S. H. Holywell
Diamond; dam Imp. Fancy E. This
boar is an ideal type of the breed and
faultless in his make-up, and his stock
are his living images. A few of the
older brood sows are Oak Lodge White
Rose 5th 3355, sired by O. L. Jacko;
Valley Royal Queen 6849, by O. L. Ot-
to-man, dam S. H. Queen, who is also one
of the brood sows; Valley White Rose, by
S. H. Victor, etc. Mr. Armstrong's rep-
utation as a breeder of choice animals is
an enviable one. Representatives of this

and ideal type, and is now in calf to
the stock bull. Another is Honey-suckle
2nd (imp.), sire Rosario; dam Honey-
suckle, by Coldstream. She is another
big, thick cow, with straight, smooth
lines, and is now suckling a two-months-
old heifer calf by the stock bull. Win-
old Beauty 3rd (imp.) is sired by the
some Beauty 3rd, Lord James; dam
Winsome Beauty, by Ravensworth. She
also is a roan, of perfect type and qual-
ity, now in calf to Royal Emperor;
Jilt 22nd is sired by Spicewood; dam
Jilt 19th, by Red Rover. She, too, is
suckling a heifer calf by the stock bull.
Duchess of Gloster 45th is an extra good
cow, sired by Imp. Grand Sweep; dam
Duchess of Gloster 24th, by Imp. Duke
of Lavender. Crimson Fuchsia 9th, sired
by Imp. Clan Campbell, dam Crimson
Arundel, by Imp. Lewis Arundel, is an-
other good one; and thus we might go on.
