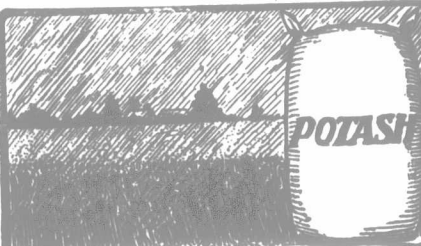

A correspondent writes: "When you report that the Dominion Shorthorn Breeders' Association have decided to fall in line with Mr. Hodson's National Record scheme, etc., why do you not tell the public that the vote of the directors of this association stood 10 to 7 against the principle?"

Seldom Seen, the first-prize yearling bull at the show and sale of Shorthorns at Belfast, Ireland, on March 30th, a roan, by Fenman (81039), was purchased by Mr. Millar, Birkenhead, for South America at 140 guineas. He was bred by Mr. J. J. Adams, Clones, and shown by Mr. Hugh McCracken, Cunningham, Newtownards.

The imported Hackney stallion, Gay Rosador (7089), whose picture appears on another page in this issue, the property of the West Elgin Hackney Breeders' Association, is a beautiful and typical six-year-old dark chestnut horse, standing 15 hands 2 inches, with magnificent action, great courage and style, combining substance with quality, entitling him to the first rank as a Hackney sire. His breeding is in the purple, being a son of the champion of all England, Rosador (4964), a grandson of the noted Danegelt (174), sold when fifteen years old for \$25,000 to Sir Walter Gilbey, and the grandson of that greatest of Hackney sires, Denmark (177). He, therefore, combines in his breeding the blood of the great quartette of champions, Rosador, Connaught, Rufus and Danegelt, and traces to those great foundation sires of the Hackney, Wild-fire, Fireaway, Shales, Blaze (foaled in 1733), and Flying Childers. The farmers of Elgin and surrounding counties are to be congratulated on having the services of so excellent a sire of the highest-selling class of harness horses brought within their reach, and the company controlling him are deserving of commendation for their enterprise in introducing so excellent a specimen of the breed that has proved its potency in producing the class of carriage horses most in demand and most like to continue in demand.

JUDGES FOR TORONTO HORSE SHOW.

Skead, Ottawa, and Dr. Andrew Smith, Toronto. Thoroughbreds—Dr. Rutherford, Ottawa, and Wm. Hendrie, Hamilton. Hackney and Carriage Stallions—R. P. Stericker, Chicago, and Wm. West, Shelburne, Vt. Heavy Draft Horses—R. P. Stericker, Chicago, and Robt. Graham, Claremont. Trotters and Roadsters—Dr. Sinclair, Cannington, and Robt. Graham. Harness Horses—Wm. West; R. P. Stericker, and W. J. Stark. Saddle Horses and Hunters—Col. Bridge, C. B., and Major Drage, London, Eng.; Jas. G. Marshall, New York; Colin Campbell, Montreal, and W. S. Spark, Canterbury, Eng. Polo Ponies—Edward Cary, Buffalo. Ponies—Wm. West. The only heavy draft horses for which prizes are offered at this show are mares and geldings, single, in pairs, and a team of four—the Spring Stallion Show for Clydesdales and Shires having been held in February. The classification for Hackney, Thoroughbred and Roadster stallions, and saddle and harness horses and ponies for the coming horse show is very liberal and varied, \$7,000 being offered in prizes, and the indications are that the show will be the best in the series.
