Scenteds and Colongs also went fairly well. Indian teas have shown little change, the common grades still continuing very cheap, but Ceylons make a further advance in values, the light supplies being apparently unable to satisfy the continually good demand for these growths. In the private market, business was chiefly transacted in N. S. Foochow Congous, among which Saryunes secured the largest share, though most other sorts also in fair request. In the terminal market a marked advance in prices for near deliveries has taken place. The belief that September and October deliveries have been sold and remain uncovered has brought these two months into special request, and most of the business done was confined to them."




