AUTHOR OF THE MORMON BIBLE.—The New England Standard has published an account of the life of the late Rev. John Campbell, author of the Mormon Bible. He was the actual compiler of most of what is known as the Mormon Bible. He wrote it during a period of delicate health, to legitimate his name as a religious writer. He died in the summer of 1850, and was buried in the cemetery at the residence of his wife, Mrs. Campbell, near the city of New York. He was the father of the late Mrs. Grant, of the New York Standard, calling some years since upon Mr. Spaulding, who had the manuscript of this book shown to him, and was also informed by Mr. Spaulding that he had hopes of obtaining some pecuniary advantages from the sale of the book. Mr. Spaulding has been dead some years, though it is believed that his wife is still living in the United States. Canada.—The first session of the fourth Parliament of the Province of Canada has now fairly commenced, and Quebec has again taken her seat in the legislative chamber of the country. The great question which is likely to occupy the attention of Parliament, is that of the extension of the Province. It will be emphatically a Railroad question, and this, no one desiring the advancement and prosperity of our country will regret. The debate on the appointment of the Railroad Commission was evidence that several members, as well as their constituents, are fully alive to the necessity of being represented on that Commission. Considering that but fifteen members constitute the committee, and that these fifteen had to be chosen out of a body of 84, representing different parts of the country, and being more or less interested in different routes, we feel that the selection that has been made is a most judicious one, and the vote of 75 to 5 clearly proves that all parties are perfectly satisfied. There are no less than twenty applications in the Official Gazette, for charters to construct new lines of railway, and for extension of charters already granted, by which the capital of Companies may be increased, or the lines extended; so that it is very certain that they will have their hands full.—Quebec Gazette.
