

afforded, and who shall investigate into the state and condition of all Paupers receiving continuous relief out of the monies voted for the Relief of the Poor in this District, and shall make an Annual Report of the same, minutely detailing every circumstance, so as to enable the Commissioners to judge of the propriety of continuing, or otherwise, such relief as aforesaid; and said Commissioners shall have power and are hereby authorized to remunerate, out of such funds, such person so appointed; and provided further, that His Excellency the Governor be empowered to nominate and appoint four Medical Practitioners, resident within the District, to act as, and be, the District Surgeons or Medical Attendants of the District of Saint John's; and to deduct the sum of One Hundred and Twenty Pounds, from the said sum, towards defraying the Salaries of the four District Surgeons, being the sum of Thirty Pounds for each, for the said period; and a further sum of Forty Pounds towards the purchase of Medicines, to be dispensed in the District—tenders for the supply and dispensing of such Medicines to be called for by public notice, and the lowest tender shall be preferred.

And a further sum of Seven Hundred and Fifty Pounds, towards the support of the Poor of the Out-Ports,—provided that the same shall be disbursed by Commissioners, to be appointed by His Excellency the Governor, in the several Electoral Districts; and the particulars of such disbursements shall in detail be made to His Excellency, for the use of the Legislature.
