afforded, and who shall investigate into the state and condition of all Relief of the Poor. Paupers receiving continuous relief out of the monies voted for the St. John's. Relief of the Poor in this District, and shall make an Annual Report of the same, minutely detailing every circumstance, so as to enable the Commissioners to judge of the propriety of continuing, or otherwise, such relief as aforesaid; and said Commissioners shall have power and are hereby authorized to remunerate, out of such funds, such person so appointed; and provided further, that His Excellency the Governor be empowered to nominate and appoint four Medical Practitioners, resident within the District to act as, and be, the District Surgeons District Surgeons to or Medical Attendants of the District of Saint John's; and to deduct be appointed. the sum of One Hundred and Twenty Pounds, from the said sum. towards defraying the Salaries of the four District Surgeons, being the sum of Thirty Pounds for each, for the said period; and a further sum of Forty Pounds towards the purchase of Medicines, to be dispensed in the District-tenders for the supply and dispensing of such Medicines Supply of Medicines. to be called for by public notice, and the lowest tender shall be preferred.

And a further sum of Seven Hundred and Fifty Pounds, towards the Relief of the Poor in support of the Poor of the Out-Ports,-provided that the same shall the Out-Ports. be disbursed by Commissioners, to be appointed by His Excellency the Governor, in the several Electoral Districts; and the particulars of such disbursements shall in detail be made to His Excellency, for the use of the Legislature.

And a further sum of Sixty Pounds, as a retiring salary to John John Buckingham's Buckingham, of Carbonear, Esquire, in consideration of his services Pension. as Stipendiary Magistrate in Conception Bay; this sum being identical with that sum voted in the Bill of Supply for the year ending the 30th June, 1838, and not paid owing to certain circumstances, contingent on its payment, not having taken place; the said sum is now re-appropriated as a retiring salary for the said John Buckingham, Esquire.

And a further sum of Two Hundred and Ten Pounds Nineteen Sick Paupers. Shillings and Eight Pence, to enable His Excellency to discharge the debt due to the Directors of the Saint John's Hospital, for Paupers admitted into the said institution.

And a further sum of Two Hundred and Fifty Pounds, towards de- Fog Guns.

fraying the expense of Firing Fog Guns. And a further sum of Twenty-five Pounds, towards defraying the Sub-Collector Quarter's Salary, from the 18th August to the 18th November, of the Greenspond.

Sub-Collector for the Port of Green's Pond. And a further sum of One Hundred Pounds, towards the support of Mrs. Blaikie's Pen-Sarah Blaikie, Widow of the late James Blaikie, Esquire, Stipendiary sion. Magistrate for the District of Saint John's, and Clerk of the Supreme

and Circuit Courts for many years. And a further sum of Twenty-six Pounds, towards compensating Wm. Martin. William Martin, for his past services as High Constable of Conception

And a further sum of Ten Pounds, towards remunerating James James McDonald.

McDonald, of Harbour-Grace, for supporting a deserted Child (Thomas Fanning.)

And a further sum of Three Pounds Eleven Shillings and Six- John Cummins. Pence, towards defraying the expense of Registering Voters in the District of Ferryland, by John Cummins, in the year 1835.

And a further sum of Twenty-six Pounds, towards the support of Matthew Steven-Matthew Stevenson, for the loss of his Office as Clerk of the Peace at son's Pension. Harbour Grace.
