Brussels, via London, Sept. 16-General von Bissing, the governorgeneral of Belgium has issued an order against the boycotting, blacklisting, insulting or threatening other wise to injure Germans or persons showing German sympathies or trading with German firms. The maximum penalty for disobedience of the order is two years' imprisonment or a fine of 10,000 marks (\$2,500).
