## SHOT A MAN IN COURT ROOM

Cleveland Hotelkeeper is Charged With Sensational Murder.

Cleveland, O., June 13.—Fred Maxfield, saloonkeeper, was under arrest at Linndale, a suburb to-day for a sensational shooting in the court room of Mayor Linn at Linndale last night in which Peter Cozura, plaintiff in a suit against Maxfield, was killed.

Maxfield was on trial for assault on Cozura and when the trial grew interesting Cozura became excited and it is claimed by Maxfield, reached for his gun. Maxfield also drew a revolver, officials say, and several shots were fired. Cozura finally falling fatally wounded, and died later.

## TURKISH OFFICIAL

Constantinople, June 13.—via London.—The Turkish war office to-day issued the following statement: "In the course of fighting on the right and left wings in the Caucasus we captured a number of prisoners and a great quantity of field tele-phones and trench implements. "The battle referred to in yesterday's announcement which resulted in the annihilation of a Russian cavalry force of 1,000 men occurred near the river, south of Tchouleurek and east of the village of Amashien. "Five hostile aeroplanes dropped about fifty bombs on Smyrna yesterday. Some men, women and children were killed and houses were destroyed."
