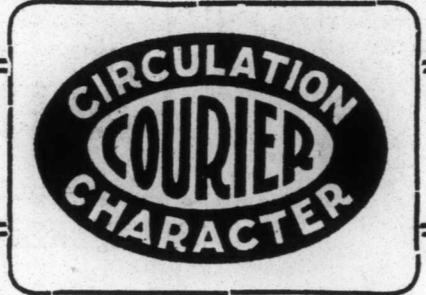

WHEAT FORTY-SEVENTH YEAR Strong Enemy by Br French BRITISH CAVALRY IS USED IN WAR TODAY Day of the Mounted Warrior Has Not Yet Passed From Being CANADIAN CAVALRY Fought to Wonderful Effect in Recent Battle By Courier Leased Wire. Canadian Headquarters in France via London, April 16.—(By Stewart Lyon, special correspondent of the Canadian Press)—The day of the cavalryman in war has not passed. The Canadian cavalry, many of the best of the world's cavalry, in the wooded region, where the enemy's withdrawal shows that the Canadian Horsemen were used to keep him on the move, and the did so with such success that in four days the horsemen captured six villages. Three of them were organized for defense, and made a western front since the Marne campaign and it furnished many incidents that, but for the great event taking place elsewhere, would have afforded much material for descriptive writers. The most dramatic of all is the case of a young lieutenant, who while leading his troops to the attack on one of the villages, the Canadian horsemen captured a trench which was protected by three strands of wire and was occupied by twenty Germans who had jumped from the enemy's camp straight for the machine gun, clearing the wire. In the best of countries running from he shot with a revolver the machine gunner and captured the gun. He found out afterwards that the unexpected appearance of a body of horsemen had made the gunner nervous and prevented him from getting into action before being shot down. A second hesitation on the part of the horseman would have meant many casualties to the men of his troop. The first time for over two years in which cavalry galloped straight at a position occupied by the enemy with rifles and machine guns was the capture of high ground in the same area.
