### MYSTERY OF SAD DEATH CLEARED UP

Minneapolis Man Confesses to Firing Bullet Which Killed Ida Duford New Year's Morning.

MINNEAPOLIS, Jan. 3.-William . Sullivan, 625 Ramsey street northeast, admitted to Police Superintendent Doyle, Thomas Newlove, court reporter, and several detectives that he is the man who shot Ida Duford, 16 years old, on the porch of her home shortly after midnight Tuesday. The girl, who was the youngest daughter of Edmund Duford, was shot while on the porch listening to the pandemonium of whistles, bells and revolver shots in celebration of the new year. While standing with her two older sisters she suddenly fell, shot, and in a few minutes was unconscious. She was taken to the city hospital in the police ambulance and died shortly after arriving there. At midnight, when the celebration began, the three girls put on their wraps and walked out on the porch o listen. Dozens of young men in the neighborhood were firing re-

The girls had been on the porch but a few minutes when Ida suddenly fell to the floor, "I'h shot," she cried, and as her sisters stooped to pick her up they saw that she was unconscious. She was carried into the house and the police ambulance was summoned to take her to the city hospital. She died just as she was placed on the operating table.

Long after the dying girl had been taken to the hospital the celebration was continued, and the police searched the neighborhood for the person who had fired the fatal shot. sone living near the Duford home who had used firearms were questioned, but all insisted that they had fired into the ground.
