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THE CITY COUNCIL

HAD BRIEF MEETING

No Definite Decisions Reached Yet on Several Outstanding Items

The City Council's meeting last evening turned out to be very brief, and little business of interest was considered. The committee on the Employment Bureau was continued until the next meeting of the council.

Mr. Wilkinson, the chairman of the committee on the matter of the assessors' salaries, was not present and on the motion of Mr. Neill the committee was continued for another month.

With regard to the street-lighting matter, Mayor Ruff reported that he had communicated with the Ontario Hydro-Electric Commission relative to securing the services of an expert to prepare a report on the local situation. The commission had replied that the request was outside their scope, but recommended a firm doing business in Toronto. His Worship said he would communicate with that firm.

The petition of E. P. Bradt relative to a refund on assessment of account of his removal from Fredericton was referred to the assessment appeals committee.

ASSAULT CASE ON AGAIN TOMORROW

Charles O'Ree to Call Witnesses in an Attempt to Prove an Alibi

The preliminary hearing of Teddy Bourke and Charles O'Ree, who are charged with assaulting Arthur Estey, of Victoria Mills, with intent to kill, was resumed yesterday afternoon and, following the cross-examination of the complainant, the case was stood over until Thursday morning when several witnesses, including Mrs. James Good, sister of O'Ree, and her husband will be called by O'Ree to show that he was in the house at the time the assault occurred.

When the court met yesterday afternoon the complainant was called to the stand again while the cross-examination by C. L. Dougherty, counsel for Bourke, was continued. The witness stated that on the day following the assault he had visited the offices of Slipp & Hanson but stated that he remembered mentioning the assault to only one person. On being questioned he stated that he had told the information in the case on Thursday, October 25th, and that as far as he remembered he had spoken to Chief Finley about it on the Friday or Saturday following the assault.

The witness stated in answer to a query by Mr. Dougherty that he did not tell Chief Finley who his assailants were as he did not know at that time. He also stated that he did not think either of his assailants was under the influence of liquor at the time. Referring to the colored man's accusation when he, the witness, was stopped on the night of the assault he stated that he had never informed on anyone for selling liquor as the colored man had alleged. He stated that he had seen Bourke several times after the night of the assault and also said that he had identified him as the man who had assaulted him. When asked when he reached the conclusion that it was Bourke who had assaulted him he said it was when he saw Bourke a week after the assault. He visited the chief of police that night but when asked if he had seen him he stated he was not sure whether he had or not. He stated he visited Magistrate Limerick on October 25th. He had seen Bourke three times on the night of Tuesday, October 26th, and had then gone to the chief of police.

He, the witness, had never seen Bourke in the daylight until in court. The witness was positive he could not mistake Bourke for someone else. He was not clothed the same way but he was his assailant and stated he would take his oath that Bourke was the man.

Magistrate Limerick questioned the witness where he had seen him and the made that he had recognized Bourke. He said as he was looking at the pictures at the entrance to an up town studio when a man came down the stairs and stood looking at the pictures. Witness stopped near the door and the man came out, took his wheel and went down street.

When Charles O'Ree was asked if he had any questions, he asked the witness where he had seen him and the reply was near the Cathedral in company with Bourke on the night of October 19th. When asked if he would swear to that witness told O'Ree he would.

When the prisoners were asked if they had anything to say for themselves Bourke answered "no," while O'Ree stated, "Not guilty, is all I can say."

An adjournment until Thursday was asked for by counsel for the defendant Bourke. Asked if he had any witnesses to call, O'Ree stated that he wished to call his sister, Mrs. James Good.

SHOE WORKERS

CUT THEIR WAGES

Agree to 5 Per Cent. Decrease in Rate and Reduction in the Hours

Montreal, Nov. 2.—The boot and shoe workers of Daoust, Lalonde and Company, Limited, have accepted one of the three propositions offered to them, said Joseph Daoust this afternoon. They are to get a five day week, six hours a day, no work Saturday, and wages will be cut 5 per cent. The other suggestions were that the plant should shut down entirely, or that the men return to their wage scale of a year back, before they got a 15 per cent. raise. Mr. Daoust says he fears the men will find their envelope too tight under the 30 hour week, but has told them that if they want they can at any time take the full week, with the return to last year's pay.

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
