



One Co-Operative Group

The question as to what length a labor or any other organization may proceed to tie up an industry or a utility upon which the people at large are dependent, and without which the generality of citizens are doomed to suffer physically, financially and mentally, is being debated in many quarters. The United States Senate by its recent action set itself on record as opposed to the general strike among the coal miners, whereby a whole continent is precluded from obtaining the fuel necessary for its needs, and without which there will not only be a stoppage of industry but great physical suffering by millions of people, and no doubt many premature deaths. The Senate also denies the right of railway employees to cripple by strikes the services throughout the country, and questions the right of a police force to suspend its vigilance over law and order.

On broad lines the Senate of the United States, the House concurring, is opposed to any group of men who attempt to work their wills upon a people to the great detriment of that people. This, of course, does not mean that a man cannot quit a job when he wants to, but the Senate does question the right of men to organize to the extent that an entire country may not only have to suffer industrial paralysis but freeze to death in the process. No one who understands the situation among the soft coal miners of the United States can sincerely believe that the granting of a 30-hour week and 60 per cent. advance in wages would be any more than a temporary adjustment. It would lead to further demands as regards both hours and rates of wages. As a matter of fact the men who are leading the miners are out to control industry in the good old Bolshevik style, and it remains for the United States Government to counteract this movement and keep the wheels turning and the fires alight as of old.

Followed to its logical conclusions "the right to strike" among those who handle public utilities and public services would eventually imperil our very civilization. Take, for instance, the strike of the police force of Boston. Or again, Toronto's strike of electrical workers who in September last threw to the dogs in the early evening a street car service on which some two or three hundred thousand people depended, and all because the head of this electrical union, one J. T. Gunn, lost his temper because he could not immediately get into telephonic communication with the head of the Toronto Railway Company. In Boston the police force went out without just cause, and for days, or until the military were placed in charge, the city was at the mercy of bandits and gangsters. Or take another instance, that of the stavedores, who for weeks refused to work on the New York docks. Hundreds of ocean going vessels have been, and at this writing are still being, held up. The trade of half a continent is disorganized, and the great mass of the people suffering in consequence.


The dire result of these disturbances filter through to the rank and file of the public in the most astonishing manner. For instance, at the moment we are facing a sugar famine, and the New York dock strikes are largely to blame. Canadian cannery have been unable to obtain sufficient tin cans

All our interest, great and small, are for the storage of vegetables in combination up together. They are inseparable and must remain so, for in no other manner can we succeed.
 When all is said and done there is only one party to these controversies and that party is the great public. In other words the public must be served alike by high and low, rich and poor. And it will be only when we realize that after all we are one co-operative group can there be economic order and incidentally prosperity and peace sequence of the strikes among the Pennsylvania steel workers, with the result that valuable foods, ton on ton, of which the world is in great need, have rotted in the packing houses.

Comments on Russia By Beaver-Brook

The following comments, have been made by Lord Beaverbrook, on Lloyd George's announcement of his policy, regarding the non-interference of Britain in the Russian Bolshevik problem. Beaverbrook has opposed intervention by Britain from the beginning and Lloyd George has ultimately come to the same conclusion.
 "I welcome it because I believe it to be wise and it leads us along a sure road to the final destruction of Bolshevism.
 "It is precisely because I am opposed to the creed of Bolshevists and to the inhuman methods by which they have sought to propagate it, that I stand against armed intervention in Russia. It is because I am a firm supporter of that constitutional system of government which the peoples of the British Empire and the United States have made pre-eminently their own, that I believe force is not the remedy which should be applied by us to Russia.
 "The soviet system of government and class dictatorship it brings in its train is so thoroughly unsound in principle and unworkable in practice, that it is bound in a short space of time to collapse of its own weight. All the Allied intervention in arms against it does is to supply the stimulus of Russian patriotism to a cause which on its own merits is doomed to failure. Bolshevism is like gunpowder; it should be allowed to burn itself out in an open place. Stonewall an invading army against it and it will continue to explode with dangerous force.
 "The Prime Minister's policy is in the best interests of the British Empire and of the whole civilized world."

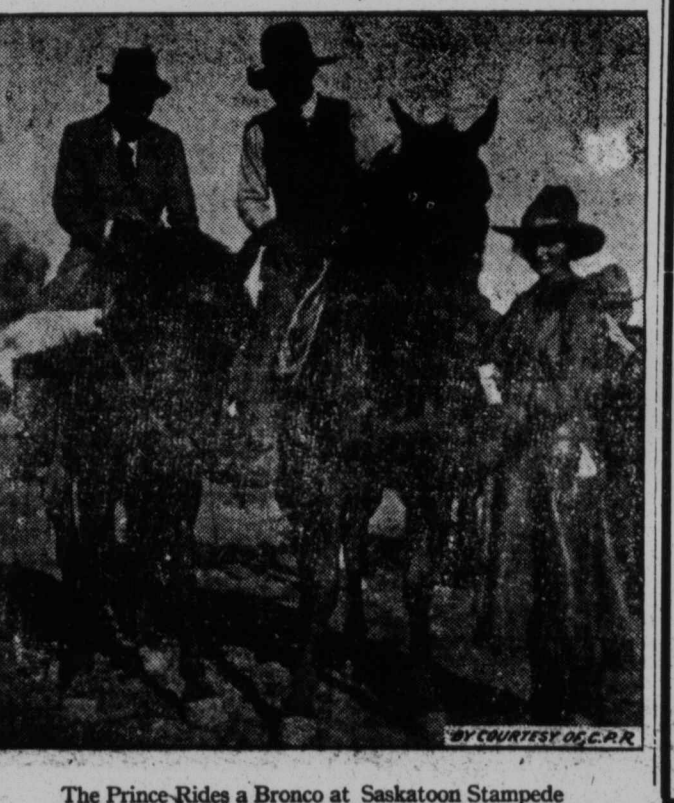
