All other individuals who during calendar year 1918 received or earned

Every corporation and joint stock company whose profits exceed \$3,000, during the fiscal year ended in 1918.

FORMS TO BE FILLED IN AND FILED. FORM T1. By individuals, other han farmers and ranchers.

FORM T2. By corporations and joint stock companies.

FORM T3. By trustees, executors, administrators of estates and assignees.

FORM T4. By employers to make return of the names of all directors, officials, agents or other employees to whom was paid \$1,000 or more in subriss.

or more in salaries, 'causes, commission or other FORM T5. By corporations, joint stock companies, associations and syndicates to make return of all dividends and bonuses paid. syndicates to make return of all dividends and politice parts shareholders and members during 1918.

Individuals comprising partnerships must file returns in the individual capacity.
