Bus Drivers Rout Detachment of Germans.

GERMANS IN BRITISH UNIFORM ATTEMPT TO LEAD CONVOY INTO AMBUSH.

Paris, Oct. 22.—Watching each and every move in order to take advantage of the slightest weakness at any point, the two great armies continued violent attacks and counter attacks throughout last night and today, according to statements made by officers and men reaching here from various parts of the battle line.

These assaults did not effect any noticeable change in the positions, although the allies were compelled to give way a little at La Bassée, thirteen miles southwest of Lille.

At Arrmentieres also the fighting was very stubborn, and the allies gained some more ground.

Two officers in British uniforms today brought to a halt the motor cars belonging to an ammunition convoy as it was pushing to the British lines at Arrmentieres with supplies.

"Halt! You are running right into German trenches," was the command given to the convoys.

The captain in command went and spoke to the two officers, who were driving a British auto. After a few words passed, the captain noted the men who issued the order spoke with a slight accent, whereupon he drew his revolver and shot both his supposed comrades. At the same moment a squadron of German cavalry appeared a short distance away.

The British captain then ordered his truck drivers, most of whom were London motor bus chauffeurs, to dismount with their rifles and take a position in a ditch beside the road in order to defend the convoy. The Germans were about to charge and a detachment of German infantry had arrived on the scene, but from the other side a French battalion appeared. A sharp fight ensued and the Germans retired with heavy losses. The ambulance had been well prepared.

Textile Industries Will Be Kept Busy.

Ottawa, Oct. 22.—Canadian textile industries will be kept busy all winter supplying orders from the British War Office for immense quantities of sweaters, socks, woollen underwear and blankets, for which orders are being placed by the British purchasing agents now in Canada.

They are asking Canadian firms to supply if possible, one million sweaters for army purposes, 1,000,000 pairs of socks, 40,000 blankets and large orders for underwear and sheepskin coats. The prices and quality are fixed according to standard regulations by the British War Office.

A large number of contractors are now in Ottawa conferring with the British agents in regard to taking at least a share of the orders to be placed. One difficulty is that the War Office regulations provide for inspection of the finished product in London, instead of Canada, and on request of the Canadian manufacturers it is probable that arrangements will be made for having the goods accepted here.

Another difficulty is in regard to getting sufficient supplies of raw wool in Canada. British manufacturers are also looking for wool, and there has been a rush to secure supplies from the United States. As a result prices there have been advanced twenty per cent. in the past few days. Canadian supplies of wool are said to be very much below present requirements.

Bazaine, in 1874, was tried and condemned to death for this surrender, a sentence which was commuted to 20 years' imprisonment, but subsequently he escaped.

Ice in the Baltic and North Sea.

Editor Evening Telegram.
Dear Sir,—Would you mind giving me the following information through the Evening Telegram:
1. How much of the Baltic Sea freezes over, and when? Would it interfere with naval engagements?
2. The same about Kiel Canal.
3. Does the water between the main land and Heligoland freeze over?
If you could manage this you would oblige many of the general public. I may also say I enjoy very much your editorial and other matter you are writing up on the war.

[We can find little about the matter. We believe, however, that the Gulf of Bothnia freezes over from side to side in severe winters and that the ports of the Gulf of Finland are also frozen up from November to March.

As to the Kiel Canal, we have no knowledge, but we do not believe it is ice-bound.

As to the third question, we have never heard of the sea in the vicinity of the British Isles, Germany, Holland or Belgium freezing over. Nor does Arctic ice drift down in these waters. So far as we know there is nothing in the way of ice in winter to prevent naval engagements around Heligoland, off the Kiel Canal, in the North Sea or Baltic.—Ed.]
