Mainly About People.

Queen Mary has announced her intention of taking lessons in the dialect of Aberdeenshire. At the concert given at Balmoral the other evening she and the King only understood one word in ten when the broad Doric was used.

The first girl in history to enter college to prepare for the Jewish ministry is Miss Martha Newmark, daughter of Professor David Newmark, of Hebrew Union College. This fact became known through a recent article by Joseph Lelser, Cincinnati, in the American Israelite, on "Shall Women Enter the Jewish Ministry?"

During the world war the Englishman who held the powers of liberty, life or death over every book in any way connected with the war at sea, pictorial or otherwise, was Sir Douglas Brownrigg. He had many contests with angry authors, whose hopes to make a scoop at the expense of divulging secret information he blighted.

Martin J. Dooley and Frederick Dornier, who have met 20,000 criminals in their 28 years as attendants at Sing Sing, and have a remarkable memory for faces, have been engaged by a New York brokerage house and bank, respectively, to guard their interests below the "dead line." A dozen big interests of Wall Street were reported willing to bid high for their services.

Cardinal Mercier has been obliged to abandon his proposed visit to the United States to attend the International Congress Against Alcoholism, which meets in Washington this month, but the cardinal selected as his personal representative Father Voellings, a member of the Belgian parliament. In his letter Cardinal Mercier says: "Please express to your committee my deep regret at not having been able to be with you on this occasion and to share your labors in the struggle against the evils of alcoholism."

Lord Sinha, until lately under secretary for India, has now been appointed a governor. He is the first Indian to be made a member of the government of India; to be made a K.C.; to be a member of the Imperial War Conference (in association with

the Maharajah of Bikaner) and Cabinet; to be raised to the peerage; to be made a member of the government in Whitehall, and he is now the first Indian to be head of an Indian province.

The governor-general of the Australian Commonwealth, Sir Ronald Munro-Ferguson, and Lady Helen, his wife, are returning home next month. Sir Ronald will find Novar, his Ross-shire domain, rather different from what it was when he left for Australia before the war. Some thousands of acres of its woodlands have been cut down, and this area Sir Ronald intends to replant with all speed. The Novar domain came to his father from the late Mr. Munro, a most eccentric man of his day, and a great patron of Turner—not the least of his eccentricities to the people of that day.

The plea of a lonely woman, whose husband has been home only three months in three years, has moved Admiral Benson, chairman of the shipping board, to revoke the war rule which prohibits officers' wives accompanying their husbands on voyages. Admiral Benson's order communicated to Captain Paul Foley, director of operations, who recommended the action, stipulates that the privilege "may be extended in certain cases after most careful investigation as to the captain of the vessel, his general fitness and efficiency." Captain Foley told Admiral Benson that ship masters in the employ of the board are continually receiving offers from private companies who are willing that they shall take their wives on voyages.

Conciliation Useless.

Autumn is upon us. Winter is approaching. The annual opportunity for plunder has come. The prospective dispute, at present being cunningly engineered through the rejection of the report of the Royal Commission, may be expected to culminate at the beginning of winter, when a strike would cause the worst possible inconvenience and suffering. The miners' leaders believe they can take the mine owners, through the consumer, by the throat at this time with advantage to themselves, no matter how much general misery it may cause. Their motto obviously is, "The public be damned," the favorite one of a late American millionaire monopolist and profiteer.

The question naturally arises, what is the use of trying to conciliate men who will not be conciliated except by the concession of their utmost demands; what is the good of making agreements with organizations which will not fulfil them for more than a few months, or even enter into them for a much longer period than that? When the mine owners make contracts they stand by them to the letter. They can be compelled to do so because they are either individuals or legal corporations who can be sued in courts of law, and who have property to respond to judgments. The miners' Unions, like other Unions, refuse to accept incorporation. Incorporation would make them responsible under the law.

We have always been in closest sympathy with every legitimate aim and aspiration of honest workmen—workmen willing to give a fair day's work for a fair day's pay, and at liberty to ask the best possible day's pay—but this constant refusal to abide by arbitration, this total disregard of all but their own, immediate, selfish interests, is becoming extremely trying to public patience. That patience, we believe, is now almost at an end. Should it break entirely, it is not difficult to foresee who would be the worst sufferers.

We are on the verge of general "hard times," it may be of an unprecedented character and duration. Unemployment may be very "abundant." It can only be lessened by universal diligence, moderation and co-operation. For miners, or any other set of men, to go on thinking and acting as if the wild financial and industrial orgy of the last six years could or would continue much longer, is surely the height of blind folly.—Morning Chronicle.

The changing phases of the moon are also shown, the apparent passage of the sun through the constellations of the zodiac, and the variations of the seasons.

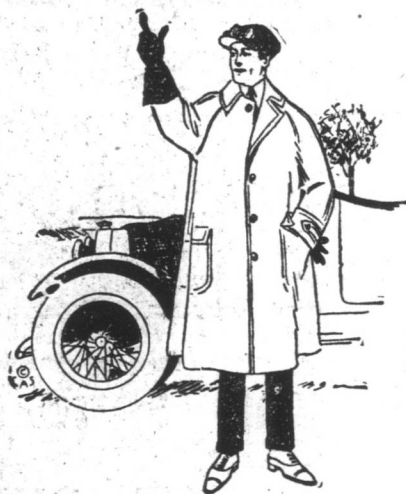

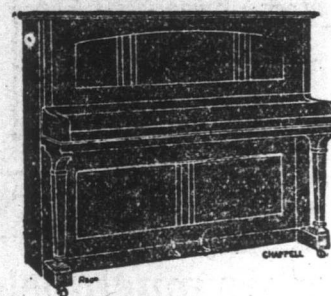
