



That ficle lady still has her puzling moods for scientists as well as moon's motions have certain small unpredictable irregularities. If she takes the notion, the line of obscurity may be shifted several miles-giving all of Manhattan a total eclipse, or else shifting it to White Plains. Scenically a total eclipse is vastly

more interesting than a partial one In the former the pale glory of the stars are seen. In a partial eclipse the tiny rim of sunshine shifting through obliterates the corona-a thing in nature as lovely as it is rare.

The total eclipse itself will appear as a band of night, 1,500 miles long and 100 miles wide, thrown on the earth's surface from Northern Minnesota, where the sun will rise totally eclipsed, to a point between Iceland and the Orkneys, where the sun will set eclipsed. The partial eclipse will be visible on either side of this dark scimitar on the north as far as Greenland and on the south as far
