COPENHAGEN, May 22. Knud Rasmussen, the Danish Arctic explorer, commenting upon the Amundsen attempt to reach the North Pole by air, said, from a scientific point, it is of no consequence that Amundsen did not actually reach the Pole. "On the whole. I am of the opinion that his flight will have a revolutionary effect on the methods used in future Arctic researches.
