## Precious Metal Magic

DISCOVERING THE SECRET OF THE PHILOSOPHER'S STONE.

The ancient alchemists thought there was a substance that would convert all baser metals into gold. This substance went by the name of the philosopher's stone, although it generally took the form of a powder or amalgam, which was meant to drive out the impurities of the baser metals and leave them in the form of pure gold.

For ages this so-called delusion persisted, and the old alchemists spent many hours over their crucibles in a vain search. It was not really fruitless, however, for the search for one thing led to the discovery of many other things.

## Turning Silver Into Gold.

It was in searching for this illusive treasure that Botticelli stumbled on the invention of Dresden porcelain. Roger Bacon on the composition of gunpowder, Geber on the properties of acids, Van Helmont on the nature of gases, and Dr. Glauber on the famous "salts" that bear his name to this day. The search for a method of transmitting metals to gold, in fact, laid the foundation of modern chemistry and metallurgy.

With the discovery of radium and radio-activity, however, began a new scientific area which has made some of the dreams of the old alchemists appear more reasonable, for it visualizes the time when all substances may be proved to be but manifestations of one elemental substance. Now a claim has been made by a group of French scientists that the feat of transmitting silver into gold has been actually accomplished.

The recipe is quite straightforward. There is no magic in it. The ingredients, too, are simple. One hundred and twenty-five parts of chemically pure silver are melted in a clean crucible. To this is added seven parts of yellow orpiment (arsenic trisulphide) and three parts of antimony sulphide. This is fused together for about four hours at 1,000 degrees Centigrade, and the result is a yellowish ingot.

This ingot is melted again and ten parts of orpiment and five of antimony are added, little by little, to the "stew," which is kept at the same temperature for another four hours. Then comes the last process of fluxing the ingot. Ten parts of saltpetre, and the same amounts of sal-ammoniac and borax mixed with a paste of scraped white soap are added to the "pot." This cleans the molten metal, which again changes colour from gold to white. It is then poured out and cooled.

The investigators claim that the mass now consists of silver with an alloy of gold, the latter amounting to no more than one-quarter per cent. of the silver employed. It is said that the result has been tested and found invariably by many competent scientists, including qualified chemical engineers, and in view of the amazing developments of late years in the realm of chemistry the most conservative men of science are loth to deny this new one.

Indeed, quite recently, Dr. Miethe, of Berlin, transmitted mercury into gold in a mercury vapour lamp, and we know that diamonds of minute size were produced in a laboratory years ago.

The experiments may be the prelude to a discovery that would knock the "gold standard" all awry, and, possibly, the bottom out of international exchange, for it is the comparative scarcity of gold, quite as much as its intrinsic properties of beauty and durability, that make it the foundation of the world's financial system.

## English Express Drove Into Sleepers

AT SEVENTY MILES PER HOUR.

How the Weymouth to London express escaped disaster when it ran into a number of sleepers and iron chairs on the lines near Woking, is a mystery. The train, which was heavily laden with holiday passengers, was rounding a curve near Hermitage Bridge, at a speed of nearly seventy miles per hour when it dashed into the sleepers. The engine managed to keep the rails. Had it left them the train would probably have fallen over a thirty-foot embankment into the Basingstoke canal.

Both the up and down main lines were obstructed. The driver of a down train, having a better view of the line, saw the obstruction and managed to pull up, but not before the front part of his engine had struck some of the sleepers. He was unable, however, to stop the express, which crashed into the sleepers and cut them to pieces.

## Notable Gathering in Toronto

Statesmen And Parliamentarians Representing 41 Nations Present At Luncheon.

TORONTO, Oct. 12.—(C.P.)—Statesmen and parliamentarians whose names have been famous in the last decade and who hail from almost every quarter of the globe, met to-day at what was characterized as the most cosmopolitan gathering ever held in the Dominion.

To translate to the Parliament of the world the spirit of confidence in its aims felt by the international delegates to the Inter-Parliamentary Union, was the paramount object of that body, declared Dr. Victor Klenbock, head of the Austrian delegation, speaking at the luncheon which was tendered by Hon. G. H. Ferguson, Premier of Ontario, and the members of the Provincial Cabinet.

Nearly four hundred parliamentary representatives from forty-one nations were assembled. Premier Ferguson said that never had so many representatives of the world's civilized countries met in Canada before for such a purpose as was apparent from the sessions of the Inter-Parliamentary Union, which was proceeding to-day to Ottawa to hold there the first official sitting of the international body ever held in this country.

Dr. Klenbock recalled that fifteen years ago he was at The Hague when the question of Canadian fishery rights was arbitrated upon, and said he was proud to think that an Austrian statesman, Dr. Lemarche, had been able on that occasion to draw up an arrangement contributing to the settlement of an international problem in which

Canada was so vitally interested.

Baron Theodore Adelswaerd, President of the Council of the Inter-Parliamentary Union, said that since it was the custom of the body he headed to hold its annual conferences in different parts of the world, he hoped to welcome the Canadian delegates on some future occasion in Sweden. The reception met with by the delegates in Canada, he said, convinced him Columbus would have made a mistake had he not discovered the continent.
