Formerly a laborer in the Agricultural districts himself, he is fully cognizant of the miseries of Hodge's condition and has assumed the very oncrous task of either improving his position where he now is or otherwise of seeking a home for him in the fertile fields of the Western hemisphere. Those who look up to this Arch and are content to go whither he directs them are precisely the immigrants Cenada requires — hardworking, industrious tillers of the soil. So far as mechanics go we are not in any particular want. Through the ordinary efforts of Emigration agents they drop into the country about as rapidly as their services can be utilized. But as to farm hand we can find room for all that can be sent us and more. The cry frem all sections of the Dominion, and of Ontario particularly, is for agricultural help, but to the wail there is little response and for the very cogent reason that the help is not in the country. Joseph Arch has it in his power to turn to our shores or the shores of the United States, thousands of the very men the country is suffering for. Shall we then permit him, to be manipulated by the shrewd people on our southern border without endeavouring to bring him amongst us that he may see the resources of the Dominion, the vast demand for labor, and the opportunitie
