1. No person shall suffer any horse, mule, buil, ox, sheep, goat, pig, or any other cattle or fowl to run at large in the limits of the City of Fernie and it shall be maintained at such place and upon such premises as the councilshall from time to time by resolution appoint.

It shall be the duty of the Pound Keeper daily sto furnish such animals good and sufficient food, water and shelter during the whole time such animals are impounded.

12. In all cases the Pound Keeper shall within Twenty-four hours and not before six hours after the animal has been impounded cause a notice, written or printed or partly written and partly printed to be affixed to the Pound gates and on the outside door of the Court House and City Hall and Post Office which notice shall give a particular description of the animal impounded and shall specify when & where same shall be sold if not redeemed and if the owner of such animal or some other person on his or her behalf shall not within five days after such notice shall have been affixed as aforesaid redeem the same by paying such damages, fines fees and expenses as may be fixed by this by-law it shall be lawful for such Pound Keeper to cause such animals to be sold and after educting such damages fines fees and expenses to pay the overplus (if any) to the owner or owners be sold and after deducting such damages fines fees and expenses to pay the overplus (if any) to the owner or owners of such animals if known and if not known to pay the same to the City Clerk.

13. The Pound Keeper shall be entitled to the following fees for posting any such notices and for any such sale:

Every owner of a cog in the City of Fernie shall annually pay to the City Clerk or person authorized to collect the same, for the general purposes of the city, a tax of three dollars (\$3.00) for each dog and Five Dollars (\$5.00) for each bitch owned by him and upon payment of such tax shall be entitled to receive a metallic plate having raised or stamped thereon the word "Fernie" or such other design as the council shall front time to time by resolution appoint, and figures indicating the year for which the said tax has been paid, together with a number corresponding with the number under which the said dog or bitch is registered in the book kept for that purpose: Provided always that during the remainder of the year 1904 owners of dogs and bitches paying the tax imposed imposed by this By-Law for the said year shall be entitled to receive a rebate in the same of Two Dollars (\$2.00) for Dogs and (\$3.00) for


